

City of Basehor
Council Meeting of March 7, 1967

Mayor Meyer called meeting to order. Councilmen present Worley, Eberth and Schwartz.

Others present: John Klinkenberg, City Clerk, Richard Warden, City Treasurer, Fred Scheller.

Minutes of February 7, 1967 meeting was read and approved.

Treasurers report was read by Richard Warden, Treasurer. Eberth moved and seconded by Worley to accept treasurers report as read. Approved 3 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Ordinance No. 14 being an ordinance relating to the election of Mayor and City council of Basehor, Kansas was read for the second time. Worley moved and seconded by Schwartz to adopt ordinance No. 14 for the second reading. Approved 3 votes in favor, 0 votes opposed.

Eberth moved and seconded by Schwartz to insert in section 3 of ordinance 14 a time of 7:00 P.M. as deadline for filing. Approved 3 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Eberth moved and seconded by Worley that emergency be declared and ordinance No. 14 be read for the third reading. Approved 3 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Ordinance No. 14 being an ordinance relating to the election of Mayor and City Council of Basehor, Kansas was read for the third time. Schwartz moved and seconded by Eberth to adopt ordinance No. 14 for the third reading. Approved 3 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Fred Scheller presented application to put beauty shop in his present residence. Reading of zoning ordinance presented the interpretation that an occupancy permit would be required to be issued by Administrative officer. Purchaser would have to assume or sign statement regarding sewage and septic tank identical to one signed by Fred Scheller when permission was granted to build house. Purchaser would have to provide for parking other than in front of residence within 8 ft. of road. Permission granted subject to the above and the securing of building permit if work to be done exceeds \$200.00 in cost.

Council Meeting of February 7, 1967

Mayor Meyer called meeting to order. Councilmen present Askew, Worley, Meints, and Schwartz.

Others present John Klinkenberg, City Clerk, Richard Warden, Treasurer, and John Murray, City Attorney.

Minutes of January 3, 1967 meeting was read and approved.

Treasurers report was read by Richard Warden, Treasurer. Meints moved and seconded by Worley to accept treasurers report as read. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Schwartz moved and seconded by Askew to grant permission to HDU to place flower tubs along the main street of Basehor. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Discussion followed regarding problem of dogs congregating in front of the grade school in the mornings. Concensus was that council could not act until ownership of dogs could be definitely established.

Ordinance No. 14 being an ordinance relating to the election of Mayor and City Council of Basehor, Kansas was read for the first time. Worley moved and seconded by Askew to ~~accept~~ adopt ordinance no. 14 for first reading. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Council discussed letter from FHA regarding sewer system for Basehor. Attorney was authorized to contact Bartlett & West and have them to revise estimate in accordance with FHA letter.

Worley moved and seconded by Askew that meeting adjourn. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Mayor Meyer submitted proposal that City & School District 458 split the expenses and share election board for election April 4, 1967. Pay scale to be the same as that paid for general election. Council in agreement.

Mayor Meyer presented letter from planning commission to be sent to owners of unplatted land in the City of Basehor and to contractors.

Worley moved and seconded by Eberth to have council mail zoning commission letter to builders and owners of unplatted land in the City of Basehor, Kansas. Approved 3 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Eberth moved and seconded by Schwartz to instruct city attorney to prepare ordinance or resolution that after effective date application for building permits shall be made to city clerk and no permit will be issued by city clerk, only upon approval of city council at next regular city council meeting. Approved 3 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
