

Council Meeting of May 3, 1966

Mayor Bryan called meeting to order. Council members present Askew, Meyer, Worley, and Meints.

Others present, Teddie L. Coble and wife, Ward Kiester and Charles Newman, Cecil Swope, John Klinkenberg and Jim Pantle.

Minutes of April 5, 1966 meeting were read.

Treasurers report was read by city treasurer.

Teddie L. Coble presented problem of sewage running across his property. Councilmen Meyer and Askew were to look over the situation and see if it can be ~~recreated~~ eliminated.

Mr. Kiester & Mr. Newman presented proposed water system expansion. Council gave permission for city clerk to issue permits for this construction as long as streets are returned to same condition. Discussion was that permission was given city clerk to issue such permits at the last time this came up.

Meyer moved and seconded by Worley to hire Cecil Swope as Chief of Police for another year at \$80.00 per month. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Sam Kemler presented question of construction of a service station. Following discussion he was referred to planning commission.

Ordinance No. 10 being an ordinance relating to nuisances and the abatement thereof was read for the third time. Askew moved and seconded by Worley to adopt ordinance No. 10 for the third reading. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Ordinance No. 11 being an ordinance regulating, licensing, registering and keeping of dogs was read for the second time. Meints moved and seconded by Meyer to adopt ordinance No. 11 for the second reading. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Ordinance No. 12 being an ordinance titled Green River Ordinance, was read for the second time. Worley moved and seconded by Meints to adopt ordinance 12 for the second reading. Approved 4 votes in favor 0 votes opposed.

Permit fee for fireworks stand was discussed by no fee was decided upon.

Mayor Bryan submitted his resignation as Mayor to the council for their consideration. Mr. Murray was to find out procedure to follow.

Discussed proposed zoning ordinance and set public meeting for June 6, 1966 provided it met with approval of Planning Commission and did not conflict with any meeting using High School Building.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
