Mayor Odle opened the meeting by announcing the public hearing was held for the purpose of giving residents of Basehor the opportunity to oppose or speak in favor of the \$15,000.00 Community Development Block Grant.

The meeting was turned over to Planning Consultant, Bill Kiesling, for an explanation of the grant. Mr. Kiesling stated the grant will be for a total of \$15,000.00. The State paying \$11,250 and the City contributing \$3,750.00. Since the city clerk will act as the clerk of record the City can consider \$1,000.00 of their portion as "in-kind" services therefore reducing their out-of-pocket expense to \$2,750.00.

The funds will be used to update the City's comprehensive plan. The plan will cover the City of Basehor and a three mile radius in the county. Items such as soil data, population, land use, public utilities and streets will be included in this plan. The Planning Commission and City Council will be asked to define short and long term goals for the city such as future annexations and purchase of property. Maps, charts and narratives will be incorporated into the plan also.

The cost of \$15,000.00 does not include any outside consulting such as the city's engineer. Kiesling feels his firm can handle the entire project.

If awarded the grant, the State requires the work be finalized within one year.

Mayor asked for the public portion of the meeting. Since there were no citizens present the public portion of the meeting was then closed.
