

**A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXTINGUISHING THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS CONTAINED IN K.S.A. 14-1502.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BASEHOR, KANSAS:**


**Section 1.** The City of Basehor, by the power vested in it by Article 12, Section 5, of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to exempt itself from the provisions of K.S.A. 14-1502 as amended, which enactment applies to this city but does not apply uniformly to all cities.

**Section 2.** That as of the date of the passage of this Charter Ordinance, any person shall be eligible for any appointed office, even though the person is not a resident of the City of Basehor or the territory within the two mile radius of the City prior to the appointment.

**Section 3.** This Charter Ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official city newspaper.

**Section 4.** This Charter Ordinance shall take effect 61 days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided in Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, in which case this Charter Ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

Passed by the Governing Body, not less than two-thirds of the members-elect voting in favor thereof, this 20th day of November, 1995.




