Mayor Odle promptly called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM with the flat salute followed by roll call. All members were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by J. Pfannenstiel and second by C. Wilderson to approve the August 5th Public Hearing, August 5th Monthly Meeting and August 12th Budget Meeting as printed. All Aye. Motion Carried (5-0)

APPROVAL OF TREASURER'S REPORT

It was moved and second by J. Pfannenstiel and second by C. Wilderson to approve the August 1991 Treasurer's Report and reinvest CD #3719, 9246, 9247 and 9250. All voted unanimously in favor. Passed (5-0)

A motion was made by J. Pfannenstiel and second by J. Barlow to pay the following bills; Wagner & Associates - 3,590.00 and Farm Bureau Insurance - 100.00. All Aye. Motion Carried (5-0)

APPROVAL OF MUNICIPAL COURT REPORT

J. Pfannenstiel moved to approve the August 1991 Municipal Court Report as printed. J. Barlow second the motion. All Aye. Motion Passed (5-0)

CITIZENS AND PETITIONS (No Requests Submitted)

PLANNING COMMISSION

WELLS REPLAT was recommended for approval by the Basehor Planning Commission. The replat consists of four lots located on the southeast side of 152nd & Parallel. Reference was made by Mayor Odle that all areas of the replat had been reviewed and approved by Leavenworth County Health Dept, city engineer and city planning advisor.

After a brief discussion regarding the sewers and lot size, a motion was made by J. Novak and second by C. Wilderson. All Aye. Motion Carried (5-0)

### CITY ENGINEER

CRESTWOOD SUBDIVISION - Engineer Browne recommended approval and acceptance of streets in the Crestwood Subdivision. Mayor Odle reported the streets and sidewalk have been repaired according to the engineers specifications and also recommends acceptance.

It was moved and second by J. Pfannenstiel and J. Barlow to accept the streets per the engineers recommendations. All voted unanimously in favor of acceptance. Passed (5-0)

HICKORY POINTE SUBDIVISION - It was reported by Browne that the streets in Hickory Pointe as of September 6, 1991 had not been repaired. Councilman Scherer commented due to the recent rain the repairs were delayed by one week.

### CITY CLERK

BIDS - Clerk asked Council to make any recommendations regarding the new let of bids for salt/sand and snow removal as well as insurance bids. Councilman Novak requested the bids be let for a period of two-three years. She reported the snow and salt/sand bids will be presented at the October meeting and the insurance bids will not be presented until the January-February of 1992.

### CITY ATTORNEY

STANDARD TRAFFIC ORD. - Attorney, John Thompson, submitted for council approval the new 1991 Standard Traffic Ordinance. This ordinance updates the municipal traffic laws set out in the Kansas Statues.

A motion was made by J. Novak and second by J. Pfannenstiel to approve the 1991 Standard Traffic Ordinance as presented. All voted aye. Motion Carried (5-0)

### MAYOR'S REPORT

CHARTER ORD. 4 - A motion was made by J. Pfannenstiel and second by J. Novak to rescind their previous motion to exempt from the tax lid. All Aye. Motion Carried. (5-0)

Mayor Odle reported the taxes will be lowered by \$12,000.00 with the capital improvement fund being reduce by that amount.

TREE TRIMMING - Mayor presented a list of trees located on city right-of-way needing to be trimmed or removed. The cost will be \$740.00.

C. Wilderson moved to trim and remove necessary trees on city right-of-way. J. Pfannenstiel second the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried (5-0)

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS - Mayor requested Council approve the solicitation of bids on a copy machine, computer and city hall addition. Mayor stated the accountant has highly recommended the capital improvements be purchased in 1991 or the State will decrease the city's state funding in future budgets.

A motion was made by J. Novak and F. Scherer to solicit for bids per Mayor's request. All voted unanimously in favor. Passed (5-0)

CURFEW - Councilman Novak felt it necessary to update the current curfew ordinance. He would like to see the \$100 fine changed to \$250.00 for first offense and \$500.00 for second offense.

After a brief discussion regarding present juvenile loitering problems, the Mayor directed the Chief of Police to check into other city curfew ordinances and their validity.

HOMECOMING PARADE - Councilman Wilderson requested police department provide security when students paint paws on 155th St. and the Homecoming Parade.

Council unanimously approved to provide security and chief of police stated officers have already been scheduled.
