Mayor Landauer called the meeting to order at 7:35 P.M..
Members present were John Novak, Mark Grube, Jerry Barlow and James
McKenzie. Daniel Hubbel was absent.

Jane Scherer, Treasurer, asked Mr. Wolf if he was satisfied with
the way the Sinking Fund and the Street Fund (1/2¢ Sales Tax) was
being handled. Mr. Wolf stated that since these two fund were tied
into the general fund this was the only way they could be handled
and could be used for any purpose.

Mr. Wolf stated at this time there are not any updated figures
for the valuation assessment. Mr. Wolf also felt that once the re-
assessment is in effect our valuation will go up, thus, allowing our
tax levy to decrease.

Mr. Wolf felt the city council should think about changing the
Charter Ordinance allowing the tax lid to raise to meet the cities
future needs. This process would consist of having the ordinance
published three times in the city newspaper and if the citizens do
not pass a petition then the ordinance is adopted. It does not take
a special election.

Council felt that maybe they should think about raising the city
1/2¢ sales tax to 1% along with changing the charter ordinance.
They felt that they have reached a point where they need to be con-
sidering full time help.

Mr. Wolf stated that Basehor is the lowest tax levy in the
Leavenworth County area.

Council unanimously agreed to have the change in Charter
Ordinance brought up on the June 2nd Agenda.

Mr. Wolf expressed to Council that they should not allow anymore
free services for citizens. If you install a culvert - charge the
property owner.

No-Fund Warrants were not advised at this time.

Clerk asked Council to include \$4,800 in the 1988 Budget for the Codification of Ordinances (\$3,000) and a new copy machine (\$1,800). Council felt this could be handled in the present submitted budget and run through the general fund.

McKenzie asked why the Bond & Interest Fund was sitting at a zero balance for 1988. Mr. Wolf explained that the fund was started a year before it should have, therefore, causing a overage in the fund.

Council unanimously agreed to set the Budget Hearing for August 3, 1987 at 7:00 P.M. Printing of the Budget Hearing Notice must be 10 days prior to the hearing (7/20/87).

A motion was made by Mark Grube and second by John Novak to adjourn the meeting. All Aye. Motion Carried. Meeting Adjourned.
