Mayor Odle opened the meeting at 7:35 p.m. with roll call. All members were present except John Novak.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by J. Barlow and second by M. Grube to approve the November 6th Minutes as written. All Aye. Motion Carried. (4-0)

APPROVAL OF TREASURER'S REPORT

J. Barlow moved and D. Hubbel second the motion to pay Air-O-Lator \$945.80 for the repair of #3 aerator (South Lagoon). All were in favor. Motion Carried. (4-0)

D. Hubbel moved to approve the November 1989 Treasurer's Report as submitted and reinvest CD #3172. The motion was second by M. Grube. All Aye. Motion Carried. (4-0)

APPROVAL OF MUNICIPAL COURT REPORT

A motion was made by D. Hubbel and second by M. Grube to approve the November 1989 Municipal Court Report as submitted. All were in favor. Motion Carried. (4-0)

CITIZENS AND PETITIONS

No written requests received.

PLANNING COMMISSION

The Board makes the following recommendations:

1) At the expense of the developer, locator tape or magnetic tape be installed on all PVC sewer lines.

2) The developer pay all expenses for installing street signs within his subdivision (sign, pole, and labor) which would be a one time only charge.

3) The project engineer assign house numbers in new subdivisions and have them listed on the final plat.

D. Hubbel moved to accept the three recommendations made by the Planning Commission and amend the subdivision regulations. J. Barlow second the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried. (4-0)

WASTEWATER TREATMENT OPERATOR

Operator Mogle updated Council on the work being performed on the sewer system.

- 1) All aerators at the South Lagoon are operational but will need to purchase braided cable that hold aerators together. They are currently being held with ski rope.
- 2) Ace Pipe Cleaning televised sewer mains in three different locations. In the Pouppirt Addition there was found to be all but one service line in need of repair and a hairline crack in the sewer main. At the North Lagoon several sags and a enormous amount of gravel found in the line. At this time there is no indication of where the gravel the gravel is coming from. The third location was south of City Hall on the Jennings Property. The line was found to be in good shape other than a slight sag at the end of the line.

Mayor Odle suggested the engineer and operator view the tape and review reports prior to the January meeting at which time a worksession will be scheduled. Operator Mogle was also directed to acquire a price on the braided cable needed.

CITY ENGINEER

COUNTRY MEADOWS SUBDIVISION - Browne reported he has viewed Country Meadows Subdivision during construction and has also talked with Mrs. Chilson regarding the possible future drainage problems. Mrs. Chilson feels the subdivision will only cause more water to run onto her property. Browne stated both the City and Mr. Wells has gone to extremes to make sure the water runoff is diverted to the south of her property. Browne suggests the waterway south of Meyer Subdivision going west should be cleaned out also.

Following discussion regarding the cost of construction, D. Hubbel moved to contact a contractor to clean the ditch in the Meyer Addition. The cost not to exceed the customary four hour minimum. F. Scherer second the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried. (4-0)

CITY CLERK

JANUARY MEETING - M. Grube moved to reschedule next months meeting on January 2nd due to the holiday. D. Hubbel second the motion. All Aye. Motion Carried. (4-0)

CHIEF OF POLICE

RADIOS - Chief Weston submitted two bids for (2) 800 MHz mobile radios and (2) portable radio units. (Bids are incorporated by reference to the original Minutes)

Independence Communications - \$3,336.22
Motorola Inc. - \$4,272.00

Financing methods and location for repairs were discussed. Council felt that even though Motorola was higher their availability for repairs would be an advantage.

A motion was made by J. Barlow and second by M. Grube to purchase (2) 800 MHz mobile radio units and (2) 800 MHz portable units from Motorola Corp. for \$4,272.00. Payment terms to be 25% down and 75% in 90 days after installation. All Aye. Motion Carried. (4-0)

FINE SCHEDULE - An amendment to correct an error in the fine schedule was requested by Chief Weston. He explained several fine amounts were lower than they should be and would like to increase in accordance with the other fines.

Meeting was reconvened into regular session at 9:00 p.m. Mayor Odle reported there were no decisions to be made and continued on with the meeting.

Councilman Grube stated he read where the Planning Commission recommended placing a street light at the entrance of City Hall. He feels this is a good idea and asked that the Mayor check into the matter. All other Councilmembers were in agreement.

A motion was made by D. Hubbel and second by M. Grube to adjourn the meeting. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned.
