Mayor Worley called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

## CITY WATER SUPPLY EMERGENCY MEETING:

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the City water supply emergency situation. The Mayor asked council if they had anything they wish to bring up before. The council wished to take part as the meeting went along. Concerned citizens were asked, by the mayor, if they had something to say please raise their hand until recognized and keep conversation down so everyone would be able to hear.

Jim Cook stated that him, John Novak, and Frank Rahija had visited with BPU on Aug. 7th, and were informed that BPU had a Surplus Main at 110th St. BPU was asked to attend the meeting but their reply was, that they didn't wish to get into any political squabbles, but if we could some how take over the water board or they could be of any help in the near future, that they were in the business of selling water.

Jim Cook further stated, that from a Safety standpoint, even if we would maintain this moratorium, new water rights, with the ineffectual efforts of the district in obtaining new sources in the Glenwood well supply, what is it going to be like in the future?

Questions then arose from the citizens as to, if anyone from the Waterboard was their as Representative? Had anyone from the waterboard ever asked for a feasibility study with BPU? and why hadn't the waterboard done something before this?

Mayor Worley said that we were not here to criticize the waterboard but to make a decision on what we were presently going to do.

John Novak suggested the City council and waterboard sit down and work together. Mayor Worley agreed that he would be willing to get with the waterboard. At this time he wished to hear what the council had to say.

Council Members- Anna Mary Landauer suggested stuffing a fact sheet into the sewer billing, so citizens could reply with some opinions.

John Ebert stated we needed more cost factors, such as a survey in and outside city limits, as to cost on lines and branches.

Margaret Sterner asked why we couldn't work on several steps at one time? council agreed that this should and could be done.

Allen Goens said we needed to talk first with the waterboard, so far all we had heard were assumptions.

Mayor Worley asked at this time that council make a decision. After more discussion and a statement from Mayor Worley, that Federal Funding may become a problem someday; three decisions were to be voted on. (1) Request feasibility study from BPU. (2) Set up a meeting with the waterboard. (3) Set up a work session.

Jim Cook made a motion to not destroy the tapes from the last regular meeting.

Margaret Sterner, seconded. 5-Yes-opposed none. Motion carried.

Jim Cook then made a request to put something out in the newspaper.

Jim Cook made a motion for a feasibility study from BPU. Anna Mary Landauer seconded. (5-Yes-opposed none) motion carried. Jim Cook said he would request this.

Jim Cook then made a motion to set up a meeting with the waterboard, when it can be arranged. Margaret Sterner seconded. (5-Yes-opposed-none) motion carried. Allen Goens to set up meeting with waterboard.
