Recessed Meeting of the Basehor City Council June 4th, 1976
7:30 at the Basehor City Offices.

Council Members Present: Mayor Clarence Worley Council: David Cochran, John Ebert, Anna Mary Landauer, Margaret Sterner, Allen Goens.

Others Present: Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk; Raymond Godard, City Inspector; Robert VanCleave, Municipal Judge; Carolee Gabel, Animal Control Officer; citizens of the community.

Mayor called the meeting to order.

First order of business was the Mayor's request to the clerk that the minutes be proof read more carefully and stated he was concerned about the amount of time being spent on the minutes and about things being added to the minutes. He asked for research on minute procedure to be submitted in writing.

MUNICIPAL JUDGE REPORT

Mayor then read the May report from Municipal Court, which included six citations in an amount of \$146.00 which were all for speeding.

CLERK REPORTED ON COUNCIL POLL

The clerk reported that the council poll concerning a letter needed to Kansas Power and Light authorizing the monthly payment for power poles and transformers at the north and south lagoons was unanimous. Also the poll concerning the hiring of two men to set poles for the new street signs was unanimous. The clerk went on to report that R.O. Barr, a commercial trash hauler, has now complied with the needed insurance to qualify for his permit which will be mailed.

SPECIAL PERMIT

A special permit form for Mrs. Evelyn H. Lindel to park a travel trailer at 2820 N. 156th St. from June 6th to June 23rd was considered. The council voted five yes to allow this special permit.

REVENUE SHARING SIGNED

Mayor Worley signed the approved use for Revenue Sharing.

BUDGET MEETING SET

The meeting to prepare the 1977 budget was set for July 8th at 7:30 p.m. at the City Offices. Clerk was instructed to contact accountant Wayne Wolf and request his attendance. D. Cochran moved that this meeting be held at the above mentioned time and place, and that Mr. Wolf be present. J. Ebert gave a second to this motion. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

MOBILE HOME AT DANIEL'S CENTER

Discussion followed concerning the mobile home located at the Daniels shopping center being served and billed for solid waste. After much discussion Mayor asked "all in favor of adding this mobile home to the city billing for solid waste". Council answered with five yes. Clerk was directed to notify Solid Waste, Inc. to begin picking up trash at the mobile home. Mayor will notify the billing clerk.

MAYOR REPORTED

Mayor Worley reported that two miles of city roads have been ditched and that the new street signs are up.

STREET AND HOUSE NUMBERING

Discussion concerning the recommendation from Robert Hrabak followed. M. Sterner stated that this matter should be brought before the public and that Mr. Hrabak had offered to come to a meeting and explain the numbering system. Further discussion developed with the Mayor directing the clerk to contact Hrabak and ask him to attend the regular July meeting of the City Council.

MR. KIM CRETON - DOG COMPLAINT

A long and very detailed discussion occurred when Mr. Kim Creton appeared to discuss a missing dog. After hearing Mr. Creton and Mrs. Carolee Gabel, Animal Control Officer, the Mayor informed Mr. Creton, since the city had not come into contact with the animal at any time he felt the city had no responsibility in the matter. Creton did not agree and left the meeting very angry.

FOLDING BARRICADES

Councilman Allen Goens volunteered to construct two folding barricades for use in the city streets.

CLERK MADE CORRECTION IN MAY MINUTES

Clerk noted a mistake in the dollar amount spent on 142nd street. The correct amount should have read \$997.41. This correction was noted and allowed.

MAYOR BROUGHT UP WIDENING 155th STREET

The Mayor again brought up the subject of widening 155th street from Highway 24-40 to Leavenworth Road and asked if any of the council wished to pursue the matter. Little discussion followed with Mayor stating he could now assume the council has no interest in the matter.

MODEL AIRPLANE NOISE

Mayor mentioned that there had been several complaints from citizens concerning the noise from model airplanes. Council felt concern and asked that the clerk inform the newspaper of their wishes that these noises stop by 8:30 in the evening.

There being no further business M. Sterner moved that this meeting be adjourned. D. Cochran gave a second to this motion. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.
