MAYOR RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL COMMITTEE'S

Mayor called the meeting order with a Mayor's recommendation that committees be formed of council members: 1. STREETS: C. Worley and Bernard Eberth, 2. FINANCE: D. Cochran and A. Landauer; 3. SANITATION:(sewer & solid waste) J. Ebert and M. Sterner; 4. POLICE & PUBLIC SAFETY: B. Eberth and A. Landauer; 5. ANIMAL CONTROL: M. Sterner and D. Cochran; no action was taken. Council's response to the Mayor's recommendation was that these committees should be discussed at a special meeting and the guide lines and duties set up. J. Ebert made a motion that the Mayor's committee request be voted on by council. Worley seconded the motion. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

MAYOR'S RECOMMENDATION FOR APPOINTMENT OF CITY OFFICER'S

1. Municipal Judge-Robert Van Cleave. Cochran motion to accept this appointment. A. Landauer seconded. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.
2. City Clerk- Sylvia Lovvorn. Worley moved to accept this appointment. J. Ebert seconded. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.
3. City Treasurer-Richard Warden. A. Landauer moved this recommendation for appointment be accepted. Worley seconded. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.
4. City Attorney-John Murray. Worley moved seconded by Cochran this appointment be accepted. Five nay-this recommended appointment was defeated. Mayor then ask council for an attorney's name to be submitted. There was none.
5. City Engineer-Leo Martell. J. Ebert moved seconded by C. Worley this appointment be accepted. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.
6. Chief of Police-Earl Reavis. M. Sterner moved seconded by J. Ebert this appointment be accepted. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.
7. City Inspector-no action
8. Police Reserve: Leonard Lacy-Ebert moved seconded by Landauer-5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Robert Gabel-Ebert moved seconded by Worley- 5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Larry Eyerly-Landauer moved seconded by Ebert-5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Charles Willis-Sterner moved second by Cochran-5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Harold Kocher-Landauer moved second by Ebert-5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Council felt since Ken Novo-Gradac has turned in his resignation and building inspector and was not re-appointed he should be informed.

MINUTES APPROVED

The minutes were approved as printed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Cochran moved immediate investment of \$10,000.00 in CD's for 90 days at the First State Bank in Tonganoxie. Worley second this motion. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried. M. Sterner moved to accept the treasurers report and to adopt appropriation ordinance #97 as printed. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

STORM WARNING MONITOR

Warden ask about the storm warning monitor. Mayor will inquire.

SPECIAL PERMIT FOR MOBILE HOME

Mr. and Mrs. Earl Hensley appeared requesting a special permit for an aging parent. All papers were in order. There was no one from the Hensley area to protest this action. Following discussion Worley moved second by A. Landauer this special permit be granted on a yearly basis. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

KLINKENBERG-CITIZENS AGAINST SOLID WASTE

Mrs. Naomia Klinkenberg acted as spokes person for a group of 15 citizens proposing an amendment to city Ordinance #94. She was informed that the council felt they had a good ordinance. She then stated that there will be a petition circulated to cause this to come to a vote of the people.

Virginia Williams entered.

TOO MUCH SPEED ON CIRCLE DRIVE

Barbara Riddley appeared to ask what the speed limit was in residential area. She was told this, according to state law, was 30 miles per hour. She felt that was too high in the Rickel addition.

HARBOUR BROTHERS-CONCERNING RICKEL STREETS

A representative of the Harbour Brothers Co. appeared to state that work will begin as soon as the contract has been received.

SHOCKS FOR POLICE CAR

Earl Reavis asked for the authority to purchase new shocks for the city police car. Ebert moved second by A. Landauer this be allowed. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

LEO MARTELL/CITY ENGINEER

Martell submitted a lengthy report concerning lagoon testing. Martell recommended flow measure equipment be purchased. He estimated the cost to : adjust manhole to be \$500.00, flow machinery and equipment \$1,500.00 plus the cost of electricity per lagoon. After much discussion Martell was directed to get a cost estimate on machinery, equipment and installation per lagoon. J. Ebert made a motion that a letter be sent to the state by Martell telling them of our plans and what the city is doing, also that Martell be directed to get a cost estimate on machinery, equipment and installation per lagoon on the flow measuring procedure. Sterner second. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried. Martell stated that the State has changed their design criteria since the lagoon system was designed for Basehor, Martell was asked to check on the Rickel street project in the near future.

FLOOD INSURANCE-RESOLUTIONS

Mayor was authorized by council to sign the needed Flood Insurance Resolutions and to date them June 3rd, 1975.

NO PARKING SIGNS COST

J. Ebert gave the estimated cost for the purchase of no parking signs to be \$257.45. This would include 26 signs reading "NO PARKING THIS SIDE", 1 "NO PARKING HERE TO ALLEY", 27-10 foot poles and bolts. Ebert was asked to get a catalog from the Allen Marking company.

ORDINANCE #102

Mayor gave the first reading of Ordinance #102 an ordinance prohibiting parking in certain areas and providing for installation of NO PARKING signs. M. Sterner moved second by A. Landauer this ordinance be accepted on the first reading. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried. Ebert moved second by Worley and emergency be declared and Ordinance #102 be adopted on the second reading. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

AMBULANCE-REPORT

A. Landauer read from several state laws dealing with ambulance service K.S.A. 79-1952. J. Ebert felt that this should be taken to the county commissioners requesting Basehor be used as a central area. Discussion followed with no action.

CROSS-WALK TAPE

J. Ebert reported the plastic tape that had been discussed in unavailable now only through a contractor.

LEAVENWORTH CITY-COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT REQUEST LETTER

Ben Boyer, director of the Leavenworth City-County Department, is requesting something in writing from the council giving his department the authority to charge \$30.00 for the perk tests made in area's not accessible to city sewers. Council directed clerk to send a copy of the minutes when this matter was considered and so directed. Sterner moved second by Cochran this action be taken. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

ORDINANCE #98, concerning Municipal Court Clerk

This ordinance was tabled pending further study.

ORDINANCE #99, commercial property & commercial haulers

Ordinance #99, an ordinance amending Ordinance #94, providing that any property containing three or more living units shall be regarded as commercial property and providing for permit for commercial haulers hauling garbage, refuse and other waste material from commercial and industrial properties, was given the second reading. Worley moved second by Landauer this ordinance be adopted. Four yes-one nay (Cochran). Motion Carried.

ORDINANCE #100, BASEHOR SENTINEL

An ordinance naming the Basehor Sentinel the legal publication for the City of Basehor was given the first reading. Cochran moved second by Landauer this ordinance be accepted on the first reading. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

ORDINANCE #101, city salaries

This ordinance was tabled.

BUDGET MEETING FOR COUNCIL

Budget meeting for the council was set for July 8th at 7:30 at the city offices. Cochran moved second by A. Landauer this meeting date be accepted. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

ANIMAL CONTROL

Cochran recommended the city enter into contract with the animal control co. for one year at \$60.00 per month, that Dr. Andrews in Bonner Springs be used and that a leash law not be adopted at this time. This action would be using our present ordinances governing dogs. Cochran then moved second by Sterner that Robert Dunham be appointed as animal control officer. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried. Mayor then authorized Cochran to contact Robert Dunham of Animal Control Co. for a contract. Mayor then read a proposal from Dr. Gordon Wasson of Tonganoxie concerning the keeping of animals that had been picked up. Discussion followed with no action.

Warden stated that he will get prices on fire hose for the July meeting.

SOLID WASTE-EXEMPTIONS

The following people were considered for solid waste exemption: Katherine Hicks, Ruth Knight, Walter Robinnett and James Buchannan. Sterner moved second by Ebert to exempt Katherine Hicks due to medical reasons. 3-yes 1-nay and 1-abstention. Motion Carried. Sterner moved second by Ebert to exempt Ruth Knight when certificate of disability is furnished. 3-yes 2 abstentions. Motion Carried. Cochran moved denial of exemption for Walter Robinnett. Sterner second. 3-yes 1 nay and 1 abstention. Motion Carried. The exemption for James Bushannan was tabled pending letter from Dr. concerning physical condition.

REVENUE SHARING PLANNED USE REPORT

Council agreed to a break down of \$1,900.00 for animal control, \$1,900.00 public safety and \$150.00 recreation. Ebert moved second by Cochran this action be accepted. Five yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

There being no further business this meeting was adjourned at 11:05
