City Council Meeting February 5, 1974

Council Members Present: Mayor Eberth, Councilmen, Clarence Worley, David Cochran,
John Novak and John Ebert.

Others Present; John Murray, City Attorney; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Sylvia
Lovvorn, City Clerk; Earl Reavis, Chief of Police; Harry Zacharias,
Animal Control Officer; Ken Novo-Gradac, City Inspector; Leo Martell
and citizens of the community.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the regular meeting January
15th were approved as printed.

Treasurers report was presented. Discussion followed concerning investments in Tre-
asure Bills and Certificates of Deposit. Cochran moved second by Worley the city
invest \$5,000.00 from Special Highway, \$5,000.00 from the General Funds for 60 days
in United States Treasurers Bills and \$2,000.00 from Basehor Sewer Fund, and \$3,000.00
from Bond and Interest Accounts in Certificate of Deposit for 60 days. 5-yes-opposed
none. Motion Carried. Novak moved second by Ebert the Treasurers report be approved
and appropriation Ordinance #81 be adopted. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Council stated again that Joe Carney must put on his bill where rock has been placed.

Jerry Gibbs appeared to protest Ordinance #92, annexing his property on 142nd St.
Also appearing to protest were Mr. Earl Staatz, Mr. Lloyd Webb. Murray presented the
tax rate of the City to be 82.4346--80.7106 and County (Fairmount) 45---81.4586, 46---
79.4346, 47---81.6346, 48---79.4346, 49---73.4676.

All people present protesting Ordinance #92 were told that the council's intent was
to square up the city boundaries.

Mrs. James R. Journey appeared protesting annexation also. The Journey home is located
on Highway 73.

Melvin Bridges also appeared questioning annexation.

James R. Hoffman appeared requesting a special permit from the council to allow a
trailer to be moved onto his property to house his ailing mother as she is not able
to live unattended. Much discussion followed concerning this matter. Ebert moved
second by LoScalzo to approve this special temporary permit providing Mr. Hoffman
would submit to the Clerk written permission of all land owners within vision of
the property in question. Also to supply a drawing to the clerk as to location of
the trailer on the property. Council also informed Mr. Hoffman that this permit
would be a renewable permit each year with Council approval. 5-yes-opposed none.
Motion Carried.

Leo Martell appeared to offer his services to the City as an engineer. He stated
that he would be willing to work on a job basis and also on a part time basis. He
further stated that he would submit to Council a pay schedual for consideration.
Mr. Martell stated that he would personally be responsible to the city for all
jobs by his firm.

Reavis appeared to report on work to be done on police car. LoScalzo moved second
by Worley to allow Jackson "66" Service in Edwardsville to do the work on the front-
end of the police car, not to exceed \$115.00. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

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Reavis was instructed to get prices of shocks from B-K and Jackson and to except the lowest price.

Reavis reported that the mobile and walk-talkies should be delivered by April 1st.

Reavis also stated that the cross walks need painting. He further reported that the culvert on 154th at Ripley should be extended.

Ebert stated that a post-driver is needed. Council agreed that this could be made.

Reavis made a request that council allow Para-madic manuals for Reserve officers be purchased.

Ebert moved second by Novak this purchase be allowed. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Reavis suggested for council consideration , a buddy program that would allow the citizen to ride in the police car with himself or a reserve officer. He stated that this was being done in several cities such as Overland Park and that he would get a copy of the release for council to study.

Reavis stated that barricades for the city are needed. He was directed to get some prices.

Warden then read the report of Municipal Judge Franklin.

Novo -Gradac reported that he had viewed the streets in the Rickel addition with Ron Bacon and that Mr. Bacon now is aware of what is required for these streets to be accepted by the city.

Zacharias, animal control officer, appeared with poster's informing people of the dog immunization. Cochran will ask School children to help with these poster's. Five dollars for poster board was approved.

Ebert asked if the council wished any further negotiation with the school board concerning using students as crossing guards? Council agreed that the school board should be approached again.

Novak announced there will be solid waste meeting February 6th and questioned what procedure Basehor will take to comply with Federal regulations. Discussion followed. Council than agreed that Basehor would prepare an ordinance for trash pick-up.

Mayor then read a letter to the Township Board requesting a file cabinet be placed in the Township Hall for use by the Planning Commission and Basehor Police Department. Since there had been no reply the clerk was directed to call Mr. Knoche.

Council then discussed the purchasé of a grader, Mr. Plumb representing Dean Machinery was present and presented some pirces for equipment now available. Council members and Mayor will go to Dean Machinery to inspect some of the equipment. Also presented to Council was a proposal from Liberty Machinery. This proposal was reviewed and considered by council.

Ordinance #92 was then given the second reading. Discussion followed. Due to the appearance of property owners on 142nd street, council expressed a desire to table this ordinance at this time. Novak moved second by Ebert this ordinance be tabled. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

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Murray stated the house bill 1623 provides a new approach to annexation.

Ebert stated Mr. Knoche has invited the council to attend the Township meeting March 1st. Clerk was instructed to call all councilmen to remind them of this meeting. Discussion on emergency equipment for the township as well as the city.

Further annexation was then discussed. Howard Northern and Marvin Zimmerman appeared to request that the council consider filing a letter of intent to the County Commissioners for Basehor City to annex the entire township of Fairmount. Much discussion followed. No action was taken.

Councilman Worley left at 10:50

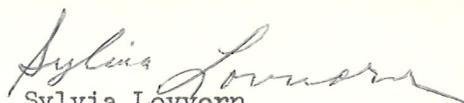

Maintenance contract for Savin copy machine was then discussed. Cochran moved second by Ebert this contract be renewed in the amount of \$165.00 for one year. 4-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Cochran moved second by Ebert the City Attorney Association fees be paid in the amount of \$6.00. 4-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Warden ask if council wished that the city books be audited? He was directed to contact Bushman and Wolf for the cost and this to be added to the March agenda.

There being no further business this meeting was adjourned.
