Council Meeting April 2, 1974

Council Members Present: Mayor Eberth, Councilmen Clarence Worley, David Cochran, Tony LoScalzo, John Ebert and John Novak.

Others Present: John Murray, City Attorney; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk; Bruce Brown-Taliaferro & Browne (consulting engineer); Ben Boyer Leavenworth City-County Health Department; Harry Zacharia animal control officer; citizens of the community.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the regular meeting March 5th were approved as printed.

Treasurers report was presented. Discussion followed LoScalzo moved second by Novak to re-invest \$3,025.00 and \$2,000.00 from Certificate of Deposit for 90 days. 5-yes-opposed none.

Copy of Ord # 83 approved
Novak moved second by Cochran the purchase of a coupon book for paper from the Savin Business Machine Co. in the amount of \$160.00 be approved. 5-yes-opposed none.

Warden presented a bill in the amount of \$249.16 from Neu Plumbing & Heating Co. to Mrs. Eunice Laverie for sewer work done. Warden stated the cause to be across the street at the Catholic Church and ask council if this should be Mrs. Laverie's responsibility? Ken Novo-Gradac stated he was not called to inspect this work before it was covered. Much discussion followed. No Action.

Bruce Brown appeared to explain EPA (76%) grants that are available for sewer treatment funding. Ben Boyer appeared to state the south lagoon is now overloaded. Brown recommended to council they call in someone in from the State Board of Health and begin to plan to meet Government standards that must be in effect by June 30, 1977. Murray suggested this action be postponed for at least 30 days after the solid waste meeting which will be held April 13, 1974.

Ben Boyer stated the Leavenworth City-County Health Department will now impose a fee of \$30.00 for permit to install septic tank and lateral fields to be paid by land owner applying for permit. Mr. Boyer suggested to the council that the city give this authority to the City-County Health Department. No action was taken. Boyer further stated that State Department of Health will be coming to inspect the lagoons. Novo-Gradac reported he had changed over the cell in the south lagoon.

Joe Daniels appeared to request a benefit district for sewers be formed for the south of Basehor. Daniels was told they would need to present a signed petition for such a benefit district.

A petition from Elton E. Phillips requesting a change of zone was referred to the Planning Commission for a public hearing.

Novo-Gradac presented a permit request from Robert Bryan for an addition to Bryan Coach Sales. Permit request was granted subject to compliance to all city building regulations.

Reavis reported radio's are in. He requested \$40.00 for installing radio and approximately \$25.00 for a new antenna. LoScalzo moved second by Ebert this amount be allowed. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Reavis asked if the old radio could be installed and operated by him in his own personal car. Discussion followed. It was agreed by council this would be permitted.

Complaint forms were presented to council by Reavis for approval. The amount to order would be \$25.00. Also Reavis requested a purchase of a Highway Patrol crystal in the amount of \$15.00. Ebert moved second by Novak these amounts be allowed. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Reavis presented the ride-a-long forms to council for consideration. These will be taken into consideration. Reavis also requested the council adopt a leash law for dogs. Reavis further stated signs must be bolted down, that the wind had done much damage to them. Worley volunteered to do the needed sign work.

Council approved \$7.50 for a posthole driver to be made by Eyerly.

Mayor requested permission to stock pile rock and cover material. Carney will haul to Kemler property with Kemler's permission. Amount not to exceed the purchase of last year. Novak moved second by Ebert this be allowed. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Council agreed the Basehor City Clerk could accept the request from the County Clerk to assist on registration of voters within the city.

Ordinance #93, sign and billboard, was given the first reading. Discussion followed. Two changes were made: Page 3--Sec c, Sub Sec 7---to read approved by the City Council and Page 7--Sec 5, Non conforming signs be changed to read--from five (5) to three(3) years. Worley moved second by Cochran Ordinance # 93 be approved following changes. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Ordinance # 94, an ordinance providing for Municipal collection of garbage and refuse; was given the first reading. No action. Discussion followed. Clerk was directed to cause an ad for bids to appear one time in the following news papers; Basehor Sentinel, Tonganoxie Mirror, Leavenworth Times, Bonner Springs Chieftan and the Kansan, Novak moved second by Cochran this action be taken. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Gene Northern appeared bearing a signed petition from property owners opposing annexation of their land by the City of Basehor. This petition was accepted by the Mayor who informed Mr. Northern this petition will be filed in the office of the city clerk. No action.

Ebert stated he had been in conversation with Robert Williamson, president of the School Board for USD 458, concerning student crossing guards. Ebert asked that the school board cooperate with the city on this matter. Williamson indicated that this matter would be considered again by the board. Ebert stated he will keep the council informed.

Dr. Wasson's proposal for dog vaccination was approved. Dates to be April 20th and May 4th from 1:00 to 3:00 at the Fairmount Township Hall. Novak moved second by Cochran this action be taken. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Discussion on Sewer billing followed. Mayor Eberth stated Judy Paski, sewer billing clerk, has ask to be relieved of her duties. Worley moved second by Novak that the city discontinue monthly billing and go to a quartly billing to be affective October 1, 1974.

There being no further business this meeting was adjourned. 11:15.
