Council Meeting November 12, 1974

Meeting was held at the Basehor High School library 7:30

Council Members Present: Mayor Eberth, Councilman-Clarence Worley, David Cochran, Anthony LoScalzo, John Ebert, John Novak.

Others Present: John Murray, City Attorney; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk; Earl Reavis, Chief of Police; Sgt. Leonard Lacy, Basehor Reserve; Leo Martell, City Engineer; County Commissioner, Howard Vining; Gerald Neeley, representative of the Mid-American Regional Council; citizens of the community.

Minutes of the October 1, 1974 meeting were approved as printed.

Treasurers report was then considered. LoScalzo moved second by Novak a re-investment of interest in Idle Funds dated 11/21 of \$20,000.00 Treasury Bills for 90 days. 5-yes-no opposed. Motion Carried.

Warden stated two interest figures can be added to the Idle Funds-\$365.90 from general (TB), and \$174.50 from matured TB. Council agreed to this action. Novak moved second by Cochran the Treasurers report be accepted and appropriation Ordinance #90 be adopted as printed. Motion Carried with 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Discussion followed concerning the solid waste ordinance. Howard Vining stated that the county will probably put this law into effect ~~in March or July of~~ ^{possibly as March or as late as November} 1975 and that Basehor must notify the county of their intentions 60 to 90 days ahead of the county plan being put into effect, or the commissioners will have no choice but to bill residences of Basehor the dollar amount decided upon each month and they would then have to carry their refuse to a green box outside of the city. 5/20

Following much discussion Cochran moved the solid waste matter be extended until November the 26th when a final decision can be made at this special meeting.

Novak gave a second to this motion. Motion Carried with 3-yes and 2-no. The meeting time was set for 7:30

Clerk presented Emergency Medical Services Resource Survey for Fire Department and Police Department forms from the Governor's office. Discussion followed.

Mayor then read a letter from the Planning Commission. Since the letter was too late for the agenda the clerk was directed to copy and mail to the council for further study. This matter to be added to the December agenda.

Reavis stated the activity reports have not been completed, but will be presented later.

SCANNED

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Discussion followed concerning the Basehor Reserves roll in the Daniel's Grocery store robbery. Reavis requested council consider paying for damages to the private vehical belonging to Sgt. Leonard Lacy which occured in a chase after Daniels burglary. Lacy stated he did not wish council to pay for this damage. Clerk was directed to check on City Ins with Merle Tice to see if it will pay. Council agreed to discuss this further.

Leo Martell reported on his findings on lagoon site. Following much discussion Martell was directed to report to council on making application to the Government for assistance on a feasibility study. Martell stated he will be presenting his Engineering statement at the next meeting.

Rickel streets were then discussed. Mayor stated he will speak to Mrs. Rickel concerning the many bad holes in the streets now, with a request that the streets be bladed immediately.

Mayor Eberth stated he had informed Dick Hayes, of Eyerly's Sales and Service he must remit \$10.00 for city rock used on street 156th Terrace.

Discussion followed concerning animal control. Cochran reported that Leavenworth City is not interested in coming to Basehor for animal pick-up. Much discussion followed with no action.

Novak stated that Fairmount Township has had a \$5,000.00 offer from another town for their old fire truck.

John Ebert reported on lagoon sampling.

Letter from Charles Turner concerning tax lid limit was read.

Mayor Eberth signed a proclamation for Camp Fire Candy Week to be November 15 to 22nd.

Cochran stated his report on record keeping procedure was not complete, but will be presented at the December meeting.

Discussion followed on cleaning the gutters on 155th St. Mayor will instruct Zacharias to do this.

Discussion followed concerning a side walk being put in on the West side of 155th St. from the Sentinel building south to Hickory. Martell was directed to stake out this area to determine city property.

Council then discussed Subdivision ordinance. Ebert suggested a working session to make this ordinance more workable. No action.

Murray stated the purchase price to William Nick for a strip of property 200X25 is \$350.00. Cochran moved second by LoScalzo this amount be allowed. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Discussion followed concerning a purchase of a tractor from Bernard Eberth. Ebert moved second by Novak the city purchase this tractor at an actual cost of \$1,277.50. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

This meeting was adjourned.
