City Council Meeting May 4, 1973

Council Members Present: Bernard Eberth, Mayor; Councilmen; David Cochran, Clarence Worley, John Ebert, Anthony LoScalzo and John Novak.

Others Present: John Murray, city attorney; Richard Warden, City treasurer, Sylvia Lovvorn, city clerk, Leslie Shaughnessy, citizens of the community.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth who stated that the first order of business was the swearing-in of the newly elected Mayor and Councilmen by the City Clerk.

The City Clerk then left the meeting due to illness.

Following the swearing-in of the elected officials, Mayor Eberth made the appointment of the City Officers for the coming year.

LoScalzo moved second by Worley that the appointments of the City Officials named by the Mayor be accepted by the Council. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Minutes of the council meeting April 4, 1973 were approved as printed.

Treasurers report was presented. Cochran moved second by Worley \$2,500.00 from the Revenue Sharing fund be invested for 3 months in Certificate of Deposit at the First State Bank in Tonganoxie, Kansas. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Cochran moved second by LoScalzo this report be approved and appropriation Ordinance #72 be adopted. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Leslie Shaughnessy entered.

City Inspector gave his report. Much discussion followed. Cochran gave his report on the building permits from the special committee. He stated they felt that the city might consider adopting the Uniform Building Code. Crocker stated he was not equipped to handle this because he knew very little about plumbing and electrical. He further stated if the inspector is supposed to be able to appraise it would be over his head.

Following much discussion it was decided to advertise in the Leavenworth Times, Basehor Sentinel, Bonner Cheifton and Tongie Mirror for a building inspector. Mayor then authorized Cochran to place the ads.

Crocker will continue to serve in his appointed capacity.

Ebert reported on the progress of walkway from Hickory to High School entrance. He stated  $7\frac{1}{2}$  loads of AB3 have been used and an estimated 10 more loads are needed to finish. Council approved additional AB3 can be ordered.

Ebert continued with his report on street lights. There will be a total of 9 new lights. Location of lights: 1. at inlet drive (North one) at High School.

All 250 watts-\$3.25 per mon. 2. on existing pole just south of Jerry Mussett's drive.  
3. south of fire house spaced evenly with the existing one.  
4.

Three on Parallel as follows:

5. corner of 150th and Parallel north side
6. Parallel and 152 (Trail's Place) north side.
7. on Parallel at Pierce's place.

Two Additional

8. southwest corner 150th st and Chestnut.
9. west side of 155th st and on pole just north of Landauer St.

LoScalzo moved second by Novak to adopt the street light plan presented by Ebert. 4-yes-opposed none. Worley abstained. Motion Carried.

The position of City Engineer was then discussed. K.C. stated his firm was violently opposed to the city allowing Rural Water District #4 a water franchise. Much discussion followed. As far as Viets firm continuing to serve the city-K.C. asked to speak to the Mayor following the meeting.

Ebert moved second by Worley that Ordinance #86, an ordinance giving Rural Water District #4 a water franchise, be tabled at this time. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Murray then gave the second reading of Ordinance #85, an ordinance amending ordinance #75 concerning Mobile Home Park. LoScalzo moved second by Cochran this ordinance be adopted on the second and final reading. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Bob Raines, chairman of the planning commission present three bids on a typewriter for the planning commission. Following much discussion LoScalzo moved second by Novak the typewriter be purchased from the Brelsford Office Machine Corp. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.


Ebert reported three men had replied to the Police reserve force: Lennard Lacy, Larry Eyerly, and Bob Gable.

Mayor then read a Resolution for a 4-way stop at Leavenworth and 155th. Ebert moved second by Novak this resolution be adopted. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Ebert moved second by LoScalzo that Councilman Worley be elected to serve as President of the City Council. This motion was unanimous.

Cochran moved second by Novak this meeting be adjourned.
