City Council Meeting October 2, 1973

Council Members Present: Mayor Eberth; Councilmen-David Cochran, John Ebert,  
John Novak, Clarence Worley, Anthony LoScalzo.

Others Present: Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk;  
John Murray, City Attorney; Ken Novo-Gradac, Building Inspector;  
Earl Reavis, Chief of Police; Reserve Police-Robert Gabel and Leonard Lacy.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the regular meeting September 4th, were approved as printed.

Treasurers report was considered. Discussion on money due Bruce Browne followed. Clerk was directed to contact Browne and request a current bill, this to be paid this year. Warden will present a report on special fuel at the next meeting. Clerk was directed to bring all Revenue Sharing reports to the next regular Council meeting for discussion. Cochran moved second by Ebert that the Treasurers report be adopted and appropriation Ordinance #77 be approved as printed. 4-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Officer Reavis presented a lease agreement for a Traffic Radar No. TR-6 R4408 for Council consideration. Much discussion followed. Ebert moved second by Novak this agreement be entered into by the City and that two months payment be paid immediately. 4-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Bill Rickel interrupted the meeting to request the City make Rahija & Stephens put in the tube's at all private drives on Elm Street so he could continue work on the streets preparing for City inspection. Discussion followed. Clerk was directed to write to the property owners on Elm requesting the tubes be installed. Novo-Gradac as building inspector will deliver the letter to the various property owners.

Reavis stated Gerald Elevation & David Lindblad are in violation of Ordinance #10 with wrecked car bodies on their property. Also that Elevation is blocking a natural water way. Clerk was directed to write a letter to the above mentioned informing them of this violation and giving them 10 days to correct the matter. Reavis will then deliver the letters.

Novak moved second by Worley that a lock be purchased to be put on the Police file now located in the office of the City Clerk. 4-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Much discussion followed concerning the jurisdiction of the City Police on 24-40, Leavenworth Road and Parallel. Reavis ask for a clarification on this matter. Murray stated the City controlled to the center of the road and the right of way. Murray will check into this matter. Discussion followed concerning the Police car. It was agreed by Council that the Reserve would be allowed to use their judgment on a high speed chase but were reminded of the cars age.

Reavis was directed to prepare a monthly mileage report for the Council. This is to be used to tabulate the expense of the car.

Council considered the rules and regulations prepared and presented by Reavis for the Reserve Force. Ebert moved second by Worley these rules and regulations be approved. 4-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Reavis presented the October schedule for the Reserve Force to each councilman.

Reavis ask for authorization for all Reserve to be on duty October 31 as this is a home football game as well as Halloween. Novak moved second by Cochran that all Reserve be on duty October 31. 4-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

LoScalzo entered the council meeting 9:00.

Warden then read the report of the Municipal Judge-Franklin. This report is on file.

Wesley Neu contract on Sewer & Lagoons maintenance was discussed. Clerk was directed to re-type the contract for consideration at the November meeting.

Ebert reported that the bill for the school on signs would include: 8-10' poles at \$3.55 each, and 1-30X30 stop sign at \$13.50. Also a freight chagre will be added of \$2.00. There will be a 4% discount. Total bill would be \$42.23.

Ebert stated that the Traffic Committee will be meeting to review City Limits signs, re-location of cross walk at 155th and Leavenworth Road. The following signs were to be ordered; 2 dead end signs, 2 posts, reflector signs at grade school.

Murray stated that he will check on ownership and responsibility of Highway 72 with the County.

Ebert recommended a sinking fund be started for the repair of 155th St or Highway 72. Discussion followed. LoScalzo requested that gravel be put along the shoulder of 155th St.

Cochran stated the Key Club volunteered to man the cross walks. Much discussion followed. It was stated that it is the City's responsibility to enforce speed and pedestrians in cross walk. Clerk was directed to contact Merle Tice about liability for crossing guards, and all City Employees. Ebert will then contact Walter Meyer for School Board approval on using the Key Club members for the crossing guards.

Discussion ensued on the speed of traffic on 24-40 at the intersection of 24-40 and 155th. With the opening of the Daniel's Center it was felt the speed on 24-40 should be reduced. Ebert was asked to contact Daniel's as to the State requirements on stop signs coming from the Center on to 24-40. Also to contact Mr. Northrup of the Highway Department as to any plan the State might have concerning the speed. Shaughnessy stated it is against the law for the council to change the speed limit on a State Highway without premission of the State Highway Department.

Cochran reported on the Special Committee. Cochran and LoScalzo will approach the County Commissioners to get their feeling on the squaring off of the boundaries of Basehor be annexation. Discussion followed on the house numbering. Clerk stated that Mr. Hrabak and George Klinkenberg came to the city office and meet with Ken Novo-Gradac who will be assigning the house numbers. Novo-Gradac stated that he can assign house numbers with the <sup>^^ H<sup>o</sup> N<sup>o</sup>W</sup> ~~paid~~ <sup>nee</sup> being used by the city.

Mayor submitted the name of Glenn Hubbel for re-appointment to the Planning Commission. Cochran moved second by Worley this appointment be approved. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Mayor then submitted the name of Mrs. Keith Young to replace Dorothy VanTuyl to the Planning Commission. LoScalzo moved second by Cochran this appointment be approved. 4-yes-one opposed. Motion Carried.

Council minutes October (continued)

Ordinance #90, an ordinance requiring building permit for construction, alteration, removal or demolition of a building or structure, was given the first reading. Cochran moved second by LoSaalzo this Ordinance be approved on the first reading. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Robert Raines, chairman of the Planning Commission, appeared to inform council that the commission is preparing a recommendation for an ordinance that would give the City control over Commercial signs being installed in the city limits. He further requested that a sign be purchased for the City Hall. Ebert stated that this has been approved and will be ordered.

Mayor then read a letter from the County Clerk, Charles Turner formally notifying the City of the mill levy and tax requirements.

Ordinance #89, an ordinance authorizing the adoption of the Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas was given the first reading. LoSealzo moved second by Ebert this Ordinance be approved as read on the first reading. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Murray requested direction on preparing an ordinance on paying the Municipal Judge. Council felt \$25.00 or \$30.00 should be the salary. Mayor will discuss this with Judge Franklin. This Ordinance will be presented at the November meeting.

Warden read Harry Zacharias report on Dogs and street work done. This report on file.

Discussion following concerning the School Buses being parked on City street in such a way as to cause a hazard to cars passing as well as to damage being done to the shoulders of City streets. Clerk was directed to write a letter to Mr. E.O. Lunsford, owner of the Easton Bus Service, Easton, Kansas informing him of this situation.

Murray was directed to prepare an ordinance prohibiting parking on both sides of the street in front of the Churches in Basehor. Also to state parallel only in the Daniel's Grocery area. Council approved 6 such signs be purchased. This will be Ordinance #91.

Worley moved second by Novak that the Building Permit fee be waived for USD 458 for the new school to be built. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Ebert suggested all chairman notify the clerk of all meetings being held and the clerk will then inform all councilman and mayor of the meetings. Following discussion the clerk was so directed along with all chairman.

There being no further business this meeting was adjourned.
