Recessed Meeting May 5, 1972 of the City Council

Council Members Present; Bernard Eberth, Mayor, Councilmen; Ferris Roberts, Clarence Worley, David Cochran, John Ebert, Anthony LoScalzo.

Others Present: Mr. and Mrs. George Klinkenberg, A.K. Mussett, Citizens of the Community.

The first order of business was the discussion of street lights in North Basehor on 155th Street. After much discussion Cochran moved second by LoScalzo the Clerk contact Kansas Power and Light and request three 250 W.M.V. lights be installed at the following locations: Baptist Church Corner (155th Street and Meyer Drive). The two remaining lights be spaced between Meyer Drive and Poplar. 5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried. (also that the light east at the intersection of 155th and Parallel be turned to face EAST)

LoScalzo moved second by Worley that the rock put in the alley at the Baptist Church be paid. 5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Letter from Swope Parkway National Bank RE: Taliaferro & Browne was discussed. The Clerk was directed to inform them NO immediate plans for their services.

Price raise from Concrete Materials was discussed. No action.

Council agreed to send flowers for the funeral of Mr. Bryan, first Mayor of Basehor. The cost of these will be paid for by the Councilmen.

Discussion of the B.E. Hunt Co. reseeding the lagoons followed. It was stated that Mr. Hunt has not done the reseeding. Council agreed Mr. Crocker would be ask by the Mayor to purchase 100 lbs of fescue and then would broadcast the lagoons. Further action concerning the B.E. Hunt account was tabled until the Council could inspect the lagoons.

Discussion followed concerning the Comprehensive Plan. The Clerk was directed to write a letter to the Planning Commission stating the Council's suggestions and send a copy to Attorney John Murray. This letter to be approved by the Mayor before mailing. Council's recommendations to be considered by Commission were: 1. Submit a map of the entire City of Basehor including recent annexations with the zoned districts defined by boundries. 2. Submit an overlay for the above map that depicts future park and recreational areas, future business districts, and future school developments, as well as future Administrative Center. 3. Resubmit the Captial Improvement program for Basehor which corresponds with the above mentioned overlay. 4. Retain the commercial zoning of the property North side of Parallel described as Lot 1 Block 1 and Lots 1, 2, and 3, Block 2 of the Rickel Subdivision. 5. Include all the features we wish to retain in Ordinances Nos. 13, 16, and 35 into the newly proposed zoning Ordinances so that we can adopt a single zoning ordinance which supersedes and deletes Ordinances 13, 16, and 35. It was further proposed, since Item #5 will involve a great deal of work, a working committee be formed to include the following six members: Two members of the City Planning Commission, two members of the City Council, Mr. Hrabak, Mr. Murray. The date for meeting to be determined by mutual agreement. Following the meeting of the working committee, we recommend a joint meeting of all of the members of the City Planning Commission, City Council, Mr. Hrabak and John Murray.

The City Clerk ask the Council to approve a directive to citizens to present in writing, 10 days in advance of regular Council meeting, any petition or request they wish to bring to the attention of the Council. Following much discussion the Council so directed.

Mayor presented three names to the council for the Zoning Board of Appeals. They were: Mrs. Anna Mary Landauer, Charles Newman and Robert Raines. This subject was tabled until the next regular meeting.

Clerk presented a request from Hodges Plumbing Co. for a City Plumbing License. Roberts<sup>Worley</sup> second by LoScalzo this request be granted. 5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Cochran moved second by LoScalzo to have the City Clerk notify the Tonganoxie Mirror of the Basehor Sentinel becoming the legal publication of the City of Basehor. 5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Sentinel Editor stated she had received a letter from Allen Pearson explaining the lack of warning for the county of Leavenworth. Councilman LoScalzo suggested that the Mayor write a letter to Senator Bob Dole concerning this matter. Councilman Ebert brought up the possibility of purchasing a weather scanner for the City of Basehor. Ebert was ask to check on the cost .

Ebert requested the council think on the possibility of the City buying the Daniels building for a Police station. Parking was discussed. No action.

LoScalzo moved second by Worley meeting adjourned. 5 yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.
