City Council Meeting December 5th, 1972

Council Members Present: Bernard Eberth, Mayor; Councilmen: Farris Roberts, David Cochran, Anthony LoScalzo, John Ebert, Clarence Worley.

Others Present; K.C. Viets, City Engineer; Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Citizens of the community.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of Council meeting November 3rd were approved as printed.

Due to the absence of Warden at the beginning of the meeting, the Mayor read a letter from David Meyer & Mark Skaggs concerning crosswalks & sidewalks in the junior high area. David and Mark appeared and presented a poster showing area in question. After much discussion councilman Ebert stated he would contact Harry Zacharias to have the crosswalks painted, also contact personally principal David Norris concerning the school bus not displaying the stop sign. Mrs. Judith McCully, science teacher at the junior high, stated the drivers of cars are confused as to whether or not to pass the bus when it is depositing students.

At this point Joe Daniels appeared concerning a benefit sewer district. He presented an unsigned petition questioning what the cost would be to the people who sign. K.C. Viets stated that a cost estimate would have to be prepared before this could be determined. Discussion followed. LoScalzo moved second by Worley-Viets will proceed to conduct a preliminary study on a cost estimate for the properties listed in the Daniels petition. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Viets reported on the construction of a walk way from Hickory to High School entrance. Discussion followed. Viets was instructed to draw up spec's for this project. Bids will be called for.

Council directed clerk to request a map of the 3 mile area around Basehor from Robert Hrabak.

Crocker, City Inspector, submitted report on the manhole inspection. According to Crocker once a year inspection would be adequate. Council agreed the monthly inspection of manholes would stop but the \$40.00 a month would continue to Crocker for maintenance.

Mayor then read a letter from the Kansas State Department of Health stating the access roads were still found to be inadequately graded and surfaced. These deficiencies must be corrected by January 1, 1973 so allow final payment to be made. Mayor instructed a copy of this letter be sent to Eugene Voigt, member of the Township Board. Much discussion followed. Mayor stated he made the request of the Township Board to do this grading. He further stated this matter will be taken care of by January 1st, either by the township or by him self.

Mayor then read a letter from Robert Raines, chairman of the planning commission, to Ron E. Bacon, Rickel engineer, concerning 153rd street being outside of the city limits at the time the plat on subdivision #3 was approved. Raines then presented a revised proposed plat on Rickel #4. No action was taken.

9:00 K.C. Viets left meeting.

9:00 Warden arrived.

Ebert questioned-with new developments coming in-who will pay for the traffic signs?

Discussion on the cost of building permits were then considered. It was decided the special committee will do a study of permit forms & cost, occupational permits, liquor license and any other pertinent data concerning the city.

Ebert reported 13 school signs and 3 stop signs have been installed, Stated further the bolts that came with the signs were too short, these bolts will be returned. Longer bolts were purchased by Ebert at the Basdhor Lumber yard.

Cochran made the report for the special committee on the Mobile Home code. Discussion followed. It was decided since there were two councilmen that had not had a chance to read the proposed ordinance, they would take them for study and this December meeting would then be recessed until December 19, 1972. The Mobile Home ordinance to be acted upon at the recessed meeting.

At this time Raines stated that the three members of the planning commission serving on the special committee have been given the authority by the commission to approve the Mobile Home ordinance when it is presented.

Clerk then gave the second and final reading of Ordinance #79, an ordinance amending ordinance #11, regulating, licensing, registering and keeping of dogs. Roberts moved second by Cochran ordinance #79 be adopted as read. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Cochran presented proposed forms to be use by clerk. These concerned the return of a dog to the owner. Discussion followed. Council approved the use of the forms.

Officer Reavis entered 10:20

Mayor read a letter from Robert Smiley Jr. requesting he be considered for the appointment of chief of police for the city of Basehor. Mayor directed this letter be filed for future consideration.

Clerk informed Council of Mr. Daniels request for renewal of his cereal malt beverage license. Cochran moved second by Ebert this renewal be approved. 5-yes-opposed none Motion Carried.

Discussion followed concerning Insurance for city employees. Cochran was directed to ask Tony Dusil from Bonner Springs to attend the recessed meeting.

Clerk was directed to contact the League of Municipalities for sample ordinances on Liquor and occupational licenses.

Reavis made a verbal request for items to be purchased for the city police car. Mayor Eberth request this be submitted in writing at the recessed meeting.

Treasurers report was considered. Discussion occurred concerning the special fuel fund. Warden asked if the newly annexed area was included on the last check. Warden stated he would contact Charles Turner and report to the council his findings.

LoScalzo moved second by Worley \$9,000.00 from the special fuel fund be invested for 6 months in certificates of deposit at the First State Bank in Tonganoxie, Ks 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

Ebert stated the freight bill on the traffic signs was \$32.65

Roberts moved second by Cochran the Treasurers report be adopted as printed and appropriation ordinance #67 be approved. 5-yes-opposed none. Motion Carried.

This meeting is recessed until December 19. 7:30 in the Township Hall.
