February 2, 1971

Council Members Present: Acting Mayor Bernard Eberth, Councilmen Farris Roberts, Lester Worley, Robert Van Tuyl, and Robert Raines.

Others Present: Charles Newman, City Clerk; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; John Murray, City Attorney; Bruce Browne, Engineer; Capt. Marvin Olson, Ft. Leavenworth, Kansas; Frank Eyerly, sewer maintenance contractor; George Klinkenberg, Chr. City Planning Commission; and citizens of the community.

The meeting was called to order by Acting Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the previous meetings of Jan. 5, 1971, and Jan. 19, 1971, were read and approved.

The treasurer's report was read by Warden. Raines moved, seconded by Van Tuyl, that the treasurer's report be accepted and appropriation ordinance #45 be approved. Four votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

Upon a call for report from the committee reviewing Ordinance #13, Roberts stated he had no specific report to give; however, he felt that professional help was needed in revising the ordinance. Such help may be forthcoming in the near future when an assistant to the County Planning Commission is hired.

George Klinkenberg stated there was a need for standards to govern future subdivisions and streets therein. To discuss this and related problems all members of the City Council will meet with the City Planning Commission Monday, Feb. 15, 1971, at 7:30 p.m.

The written report from the Municipal Judge was read by the Clerk and made a matter of record.

Bruce Browne reported that federal inspection of the sewer system had been completed and several recommendations made, one of which was rocking the access roads to the lagoons. One third of the cost of the rock would be paid by the federal grant money if rock is stockpiled before the engineers final estimate is filed. Council members felt this rocking should be done to comply with the federal recommendations.

Browne submitted the engineer's final estimate on Phase II to the Council for their approval. The final estimate was \$15,791.85. Raines moved, seconded by Roberts, that the final estimate in the amount of \$15,791.85 be accepted. Four votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

Roberts moved, seconded by Van Tuyl, that \$9,000.00 be paid the B. E. Hunt Construction Company on account and the balance be paid upon receipt of the remainder of the federal grant money. Four votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

Even though Browne had submitted his final estimate, he would remain in a consultant capacity to the City for sewer problems or future expansion.

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The Council discussed the sewer maintenance contract which had been in effect since Oct. 12, 1970 with Frank Eyerly. After consideration of sewer maintenance problems it was agreed that Eyerly would clear through Acting Mayor Eberth before doing repair work on the sewer system.

The Council directed Eyerly to repair a defective manhole located north of the lumber yard and submit an itemized list of repair work done. When the City receives the bill, it will then be forwarded to the bonding company for payment.

The question of installing a light at the lift station to indicate when the pump motor was running was discussed. However, no action was taken.

Upon a call by Eberth for individuals to submit bids on mowing weeds at the lagoon sites and access roads, John Jons submitted the only bid. Mr. Jons bid was \$100.00 per cutting as per specifications set forth on the bid form. After some discussion Eberth stated the Council would consider the bid and make a decision at the next meeting.

After discussion of the bonding of city employees, Raines moved, seconded by Van Tuyl, that the City Inspector be bonded in the amount of \$2,500.00. Four votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

Captain Marvin Olson discussed the editing, indexing, typing, and making into loose leaf booklet form all of the City ordinances with the Council. The question of having Captain Olson do this work was considered. However, a decision will be made at the next regular meeting.

Police Chief Swope will be asked to secure an estimate of the cost of painting the word POLICE on the patrol car.

Murray stated that Mr. Ray Orłowski, former State Highway Commissioner, may answer the question of receiving federal money for the purchase of law enforcement equipment. Murray agreed to check this possibility.

Roberts moved, seconded by Worley, that the appointment of Connie Crocker as representative to the solid waste management committee be confirmed. Four votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

The numbering system for the streets in the City was discussed. Mrs. Ruth Crocker will be asked to complete the allocation of numbers to residences and businesses and to submit the numbers to the Council for final approval.

Following a discussion of the electrical power supply to the City of Basehor, Kansas, Raines moved, seconded by Van Tuyl, that the City Clerk send a letter to the Kansas Power and Light Company in Leavenworth, Kansas, asking them to outline in detail the plans that they have for alleviating the electrical power shortage in the Basehor area. A reply will be expected within 45 days

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outlining the plan or the City Council will seek further action through the Kansas Corporation Commission. Four votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
