Council Meeting
June 1, 1971

Council Members Present: Bernard Eberth, Mayor; Councilmen: Farris Roberts, David Cochran, Clarence Worley, John Ebert, and Anthony LoScalzo.

Others Present: Charles Newman, City Clerk; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; John Murray, City Attorney; Connie Crocker, City Inspector.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the previous meeting of May 4, 1971 were read and approved.

As the first order of business Mayor Eberth appointed Sylvia Lovvorn to the office of City Clerk. Following a discussion Roberts moved seconded by Cochran that the City Council accept the appointment of Sylvia Lovvorn at a salary of one hundred dollars a month and the salary of the City Treasurer be raised to seventy five dollars per month effective June 1, 1971. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

The Treasurer's report was read by Warden. Cochran moved seconded by Ebert, that the report be accepted and appropriation ordinance #49 be approved. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

Duties of the City Inspector were then discussed. Mr. Crocker, City Inspector stated that his duties were outlined in ordinances #33 and #40. Roberts moved seconded by Worley that this matter be tabled until the council can study these ordinances further. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

LoScalzo moved seconded by Ebert that ordinance #41, an ordinance pertaining to the numbering of houses in the City of Basehor be adopted on the second and final reading. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

Mayor Ebert appointed George Klinkenberg to serve as a member of the committee studying the traffic patterns and related problems within the city. Mr. Klinkenberg will represent the City Planning Commission. Roberts moved seconded by Ebert that the City Council accept the appointment of Mr. Klinkenberg. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

Since it had been suggested at the last Council meeting that a citizen be ask to serve on this committee, Mayor Eberth called for a volunteer. There were none.

A letter of recommendation was received from the City Planning Commission regarding the request by W. C. Rickel to rezone Lot 2, 3, 4, and 5, Block 2. Rickel Subdivision #3, Lot 1, 2, and 3, Block 5. Rickel Subdivision #3, Lots 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, and 40; Block 4 Rickel Subdivision #3 from A1 To R1b single family residence. LoScalzo moved seconded by Cochran the recommendation be accepted. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

Ordinance #44, an ordinance providing for hook-on fee for those properties outside of Lateral Sewer Districts #1 and #2, was given the first reading. Ebert moved seconded by LoScalzo that the first reading of Ordinance #44 be approved. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

Councilmen Ebert then stated that each of the Councilmen had received a letter from Mr. Charles Carmitchel, representing a citizens group, asking for further consideration regarding the proposed ordinance which outlined valuation and assessment of Sewer Districts #1 and #2. The Council consented to meet with Mr. Carmitchel Friday, June 4, at 7:30 P.M.

Ordinance #45, an ordinance providing tapping fee regulations for all desiring to connect to the City Sewer System and who are not within a sewer district of the City of Basehor, was given the first reading. Cochran moved seconded by LoScalzo that the first reading of Ordinance #45 be approved. Five votes yes-0 votes opposed. Motion Carried.

At this time it was also noted that a letter had been received signed by Carl W. Nickel, J. A. Meyer and T. L. Pouppirt requesting a closed meeting with the City Council to discuss contents of a proposed ordinance that they feel would adversely affect their development properties. The council consented to meet with their representative Friday, June 4, at 9:30 P.M.

J. A. Meyer submitted a letter to the City Council requesting Meyer Drive, from 154th Terrace to 155th Street; and 154th Terrace, from Meyer Drive south to Sycamore be accepted by the City. There was no specific action taken on this request, however the Council felt that it would be advisable to survey all streets within the City to determine what type and amount of work is needed to improve the condition of the streets.

Ebert ask that it be noted in the minutes a thank you to Mrs. Judy Piascky for inserting the house numbers in the monthly sewer bills.

Mayor Eberth noted a commendation to Charles Newman for a job well done as City Clerk.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
