

Council Meeting
August 3, 1971

Council Members Present: Bernard Eberth, Mayor; Councilmen; Farris Roberts, David Cochran, Clarence Worley, John Ebert, and Anthony LoScalzo.

Others Present; John Murray, City Attorney; Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Connie Crocker, City Inspector; Ward Kiester, Superintendent of Schools; Citizens--John Novak, W.C.Rickel, Ambrose Jennings, Keith Young and Harold Zishka.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the previous meeting of July 6, 1971 were read and approved.

Following a discussion by Council and Citizens present, the Clerk was directed by Council, that when building permits 71-8 and 71-9 require extension they be reviewed by the City Council in connection with Ordinance #46, a subdivision ordinance. These permits were issued to the Winkler Co.

The Treasurer's Report was read by Warden. Roberts moved seconded by Wroley that the report be accepted and appropriation Ordinance #51 be approved. Five Votes Yes--0 Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

During the discussion of the duties of the City Inspector it was noted that all having to do with city business should have outlined what is expected of them by the Council. Council then agreed to meet August 10, 1971 for the purpose of outlining all jobs. The Clerk was then directed to notify the following people of this meeting, asking them to attend and bring a list of their duties as well as any questions they might have concerning their job with the City Of Basehor.

1. Chief of Police--Cecil Swope
2. Municipal Judge--William Franklin
3. City Treasurer--Richard Warden
4. City Clerk--Sylvia Lovvorn
5. City Inspector--Connie Crocker
6. Sewer Billing Clerk--Judy Piaskey

8. Sewer Maintance--Frank Eyerly

Ward L Kiester asked if it would be possible for the City to have Mr. Zacharias patch the drive way of the high school and the school would then pay for the material which Mr. Zacharias would estimate plus the hourly wage the City pays. There was a verbal agreement this would be done.

Mayor Eberth appointed Councilmen Ebert to act a temporary chairman of the Traffic Committee.

Ordinance #47, an Ordinance increasing the City Planning Commission from 7 to 9 members was given the First and second reading. An emergency was then declared. Cochran moved seconded by Ebert that Ordinance #47 be adopted. Five Votes Yes- 0 Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

The Clerk was then directed to attend the City Planning Commission meeting August 16 to issue the Oath of office to the new City Planning members.

Mayor Eberth ask for names to be submitted for the two positions now open on the City Planning Commission. Names submitted were Bob Rains and Charles Hobbs. LoScalzo moved seconded by Cochran that these names be approved and the appointments be made. Five Votes Yes- 0 Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

The Clerk was then directed to notify both Mr. Rains and Mr. Hobbs of their appointments.

Ordinance #44, an ordinance providing for sewer hook-on fee for all properties within the City of Basehor, Kansas, payable at time of obtaining building permits and providing for collection of sewer hook-on fee for all building sites for which permits have been obtained since November 1, 1971, was REPEALED and assigned to Ordinance #49.

Following the second reading and amendment of Ordinance #42, an Ordinance providing for assessing sewer cost to Lateral Sewer District No.1, Worley moved seconded by Ebert that this Ordinance be adopted. Five Votes Yes-0 Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Following the second reading and amendment of Ordinance #43, an Ordinance providing for assessing sewer costs in Lateral Sewer District No.2, Worley moved seconded by LoScalzo that this amended Ordinance be adopted. Five Votes Yes- 0 Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Attorney Murray than asked the Clerk to prepare a list of all building permits issued since January 1, 1971. This list would contain the Lot and Block number, Owners name, Classification of building, and the Addition where it will be located. The purpose of this would be to assist in assessments.

Mayor Eberth announced the Budget Hearing meeting on August 10, 8:00 at the Fairmount Hall to be followed by discussion and outlining of duties and procedures of all persons connected with conducting of City Business and use of forms required to conduct city business.

A letter from R.S.McKee; Director City-County Health Department, was discussed. The Leavenworth City Government is making their fogging equipment available to Basehor for the purpose of spraying mosquito. Cost will be \$10.00 per hour for the driver-operator and vehicle plus diesel fuel and insecticide needed for fogging. An additional rider will have to be furnished by the City of Basehor for this service as a safty measure and to assist in directing the driver to all sections of the City. Following discussion the Clerk was directed to make arrangements for this service for the City of Basehor.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
