Council Meeting

September 7, 1971

Council Members Present: Bernard Eberth, Mayor; Councilman David Cochran,
Clarence Wroley, John Ebert, Anthony LoScalzo.

Others Present: John Murray, City Attorney; Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk;
Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Judy Piascky, Sewer billing
Clerk; Ben Boyer & John Evans, Port Authority; Citizens of
the coumminty.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the previous meeting
of August 10, 1971 were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report was read by Warden. LoScalzo moved seconded by Cochran
that the report be accepted and apporpriation Ordinance #52 be approved. Four
Votes Yes- No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Treasurer Warden read special assessments paid: Lateral #1---\$7,600.00 and
Lateral #2---\$9,974.00

The Bryce E. Hunt account was then discussed. Treasurer Warden recommended
that a transfer be made of \$2,567.78 from the Sewer Department to the Sewer
Construction Account to pay Mr. Hunt balance due, in the sum of \$3,291.85.
Ebert moved seconded by Worley that this transfer be made and the Hunt account
be paid. Four Votes Yes-No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Councilman Ebert then reported on the findings of the Traffic Study Committee.
Ebert then read the recommendation submitted by the Traffic Study Committee;
removal of the traffic control bumps at Ripley and 155th Street Terrace, Ripley
at 156th Street and Maple at 156th Street. Council agreed stop signs should be
put up first, remove bumps then resurface streets. LoScalzo moved seconded by
Worley this recommendation be adopted at location mentioned. Four Votes Yes-
No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Ebert announced the Traffic Study Committee will have their next meeting Sept
15, 8:00p.m. Officer Reavis and Swope will be invited to consult on speed limits
throughout the City of Basehor.

Mayor appointed Councilman Ebert to inquire about the cost of 6 stop signs.

The Council called for reports from City Officers; Municipal Judge Franklin was
present and reported that there were no traffic cases to report. There were
no other Officers present and no written reports turned in.

Council directed the Clerk to remind the City Officers that the Council would
appreciate a written report from each of them each month. If they have nothing
to report this report would so state.

Mr. Ben Boyer and Mr. John Evans, representing the Leavenworth County Port Authority appeared before the Council to present the idea of Basehor becoming a member of the Port Authority. Discussion followed. The following statements were made: Tax payers are not obligated--bonds will take care of spiraling property tax--Basehor would need to join by resolution --cost to Basehor would be a \$50.00 token fee only--create jobs for the people of Basehor. Mr. Evans, Vice Chairman of Leavenworth County Port Authority extended an invitation to the Basehor Council to send a representative to the next meeting Sept 15, 7:30 at the Court House in Leavenworth. No action was taken.

Attorney Murray announced to the Council that New Regional Maps will be put out with in the next two weeks.

Application by Contractor to preform sewer connections for Vencent D. Wynne was discussed. Cochran moved seconded by Ebert a letter be written informing Mr. Wynne that his application would be granted upon arrival of surety bond. Four Votes Yes- No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Judy Piascky, sewer billing clekr, was ask by Murray to prepair a list of persons with a balance due on sewer service charges for the purpose of adding this to their taxes. Also to send to him a copy of Ordinance #34, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BASEHOR, KANSAS, PERTAINING TO THE USE OF THE SEWAGE SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF BASEHOR, KANSAS, AND PROVIDING USE CHARGES IN CONNECTION WITH USAGE OF THE SYSTEM.

Judy also stated, one of her biggest problems in billing the sewer srevice charges is knowing who is moving in and where. Council ask if a request could be made of Kansas Power and Light to let us know of new services in Basehor.

John Novak presented to the Council his report on Solid Waste. Mr. Novak attended the hearing for Solid Waste at Topeka and will be attending the Council meeting of Tonganoxie, Kansas. He stated that each town has 90 days to accept or make a report as to their intentions. January 1, 1972 a progress report must be filled with the Government. f f e d

The Clerk was instructed in the furture requests for building permits will be as follows: clerk will give person applying 3 copies of permit to be filled out and returned complete with drawing of house. When City Inspector has studied the permit and informs clerk it has been accepted, the permit may then be issued. Plans of house must accompany permit. Council agreeded that the present forms for building permits would continue to be used.

Mrs. Henry Porter and Mrs. Jack Fore representing the Basehor PTA asked for an interpeation of Ordinance #11, AN ORDINANCE REGULATION, LICENSING, AND REGISTERING AND KEEPING OF DOGS. The concern being dogs running loose on the school grounds. Attorney Murray stated the only way to handle this would be filling charges against the owners of the dog. They also ask if cross walks could be painted at the Junior High School. Council agreeded this would be done. Final request was a ruling concerning cars parking on the South side of the Junior High School. Council referred this request to the Traffic Study Committee.

Cochran moved seconded by Ebert that Mr. Zacharias be directed to paint the cross walks at the Junior High School. Four Votes Yes- No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

LoScalzo moved seconded by Cochran--the bill for trip to Topeka presented by Mr. Novak be approved. Four Votes Yes- No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

September 7, 1971 (Continued)

Request for the purchase of small maps of Basehor to aid Traffic Study Committee was made. Worley moved seconded by LoScalzo this purchase be made. Four Votes Yes- No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
