Council Meeting
October 6, 1971

Council Members Present: Bernard Eberth, Mayor; Councilmen; Farris Roberts, David Cochran, John Ebert, Clarence Wroley, Anthony LoScalzo.

Others Present; John Murray, City Attorney; Sylvia Lovvorn, City Clerk; Richard Warden, City Treasurer; Connie Crocker, City Inspector; Chief of Police, Cecil Swope. Mr. Young of Mid-Continent Homes.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Eberth. Minutes of the previous meeting of September 7, 1971 were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report was read by Warden. LoScalzo moved seconded by Cochran that the report be accepted and appropriation Ordinance #53 be approved. Five Votes Yes No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

A.K. Mussett ask that he be reimbursed \$14.00 for four months sewer service charges, because he is not in the sewer district. Cochran moved seconded by Ebert this action be taken. Five Votes Yes No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Report from Frank Eyerly was read by Councilman Ebert concerning the South lagoon. Discussion followed. Ebert volunteered to call Bruce Brown for advice at the request of Frank Eyerly. Council plans to tour the lagoons Saturday 6:30 p.m.

Chief of Police, Swope was present and submitted a verbal report. Council authorized Swope to have the brakes on Police car replaced. Swope stated there was a problem getting people to attend traffic court. No action was taken. Also discussed was a recommendation submitted by the Traffic Study Committee that two to four volunteer men be accepted to aid Chief of Police Swope in traffic control during School activities and Halloween. Also recommended that four special duty badges be purchased for this assignment. Following discussion Cochran moved seconded by Ebert that two to four Auxiliary Police be appointed by the City Council, that they will not be armed but will assist Chief of Police Swope during school activities or in case of emergency. Also that the badges, not to exceed \$3.50 each, will be purchased by Swope and the bill to be submitted to Council. These badges will be returned to Swope when the activity or emergency is at an end. Five Votes Yes No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Chief of Police also requested the use of Radar in Basehor for the purpose of slwoing traffic. Council directed Swope to set up an appointment to have Radar equipment demonstrated to the Council.

Council directed the City Inspector to put on file in the office of the City Clerk copies of all sewer permits.

Mayor Eberth stated that Mr. Rains, chairman of the City Planning Commission, made a request that before any building permits are issued on any pre-built or pre-occupied or modular homes they be referred to the City Planning Commission.

The Council then made a directive to the Clerk that the following questions be added to each building permit: 1. Is this a pre-built, pre-occupied or modular home YES _____ NO _____? 2. Is this dwelling to be built in its entirety YES _____ NO _____? *on the side,*

Since there had been much discussion about the Breedlove property the Council ask Mr. Crocker, City Inspector to check in and around the man hole for dumping.

A request was submitted from the City Planning Commission for a petty cash fund for postage and etc. Cochran moved seconded by Ebert that the sum of \$25.00 be appropriated for this use and a report will be submitted as to how it is spent. Five Votes Yes No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

A written bid was submitted to the council for the resurfacing the streets of Basehor by Walt Lewis of the North American Paving Inc.

Robert Harbor will submit in writing a bid for the resurfacing of streets to the Mayor.

Discussion on Police Department Aid referred to the Traffic Committee.

The appointment of Kelly Veits as City Engineer was then discussed. His terms were that the Council would assign him a job at \$15.00 per hour. If Mr. Veits should be unavailable he would sent someone under him at the cost of \$12.50 per hour. LoScalzo moved seconded by Worley that Mr. Veits be contacted and a meeting be set up to further discuss his appointment. Five Votes Yes No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Mr. W.C. Rickel was present and submitted a petition to have the following property annexed into the City of Basehor, Kansas: all of the west $\frac{1}{2}$ of section 2 township 11 south, range 22 east, laying west of center line of Kansas highway 72 except the tract designated as follows which except are small tracts of less than 20 acres previously sold by the Rickels. LoScalzo moved seconded By Roberts the above petition be accepted. Five Votes Yes No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Roberts moved seconded by Cochran that the Attorney prepare an Ordinance to further annex those small tracts found within the above mentioned petition. Five Votes YES No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Cochran moved seconded by Ebert that the City of Basehor, Kansas join the Leavenworth County Port Authority by resolution. Five Votes Yes No Votes Opposed. Motion Carried.

Councilman Ebert presented the Traffic Study Committee report which will be under study. Each councilman will be given a copy of this report.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
