

CITY OF BASEHOR, KANSAS
Council Meeting
Feb. 3, 1970

Present: Acting Mayor Bernard Eberth, Councilmen Robert Raines,
Robert Van Tuyl, and Farris Roberts.

Others present: Charles, City Clerk, Richard Warden, City
Treasurer, John Murray, City Attorney, Bruce
Browne, Engineer, and Cecil Swope, Chief of
Police.

The meeting was called to order by Acting Mayor Eberth.
Minutes of the meeting of Jan. 30, 1970, and Jan. 10, 1970, were
read and approved.

The treasurer's report was read by Warden. Raines moved,
seconded by Van Tuyl, that the report and appropriation Ordinance
#33 be approved as read. Three votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion
carried.

Review of Ordinance #13 was discussed. F. Roberts, Chairman of
the review committee, and committee member Raines were instructed to
ask a member of the City Planning Commission to assist in the review
of the ordinance, make recommendations, and report back to the Council
within two months.

Murray reported that regarding the appeal of the City on the
condemnation award to Robert Eberth a cross appeal had been filed by
R. Eberth; however, this was presenting no particular problem.

Browne reported that Phase II of sewer construction had been
given approval by the Water Pollution Control Administration and
that the contract may be signed.

F. Roberts moved, seconded by Raines, that the Council approve
the award of the contract to B.E. Hunt Construction Co., low bidder
in the amount of \$81,643.00, for construction of Phase II of the
Basehor Sewage System, and authorize the Acting Mayor and City Clerk
to execute and deliver the signed contracts. Three votes yes; no
votes opposed. Motion carried.

Browne reported that an agreement had been reached with Wm.
Nick in the amount of \$9594.10 for the main sewer easement and
treatment plant site.

R. Van Tuyl moved, seconded by Raines, that the Council accept
three easements from Wm. C. and Mary Nick and warranty deed for
9.295 acres for a lagoon site on a total payment by the City of
\$9594.10. Three votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

F. Roberts discussed the Joint Regional Planning agreement;
however, because of a number of questions no action was taken by
the Council. J. Murray was asked to review the agreement and report
his findings and recommendations to the Council at the next regular
meeting.

The recent breaks in the water lines caused by the sewer construction were discussed. Browne suggested that Rural Water District No. 2 submit a bill to the contractor for the loss of water resulting from the breaks.

R. Raines presented a traffic hazard that is being created by grocery trucks blocking the main thoroughfare while being unloaded at Daniels Grocery. Discussion but no action.

There was further discussion by the Council of violations by unlicensed juveniles riding motorbikes, mini-bikes, and go-carts. The Council directed the Chief of Police to enforce stricter compliance of the law by individuals and families owning these vehicles.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
