Special Council Meeting  
August 11, 1970

Council Members Present: Mayor Alfred Meyer, Councilmen Robert Raines,  
Lester Werley, and Farris Roberts.

Others Present: Charles Newman, City Clerk, Richard Warden, City  
Treasurer, John Murray, City Attorney, and citizens of  
the community.

Mayor Meyer called the meeting to order stating that the main purpose  
of the meeting was for a hearing on the budget. The meeting was opened for  
questions regarding the budget. A discussion followed on the special gaso-  
line tax fund and how it may be used. Raines moved, seconded by Werley,  
that the budget as published be approved and accepted. Three votes yes;  
no votes opposed. Motion carried.

Wayne Florence appeared before the Council to complain about the sewer  
line not being deep enough to drain his basement. Florence was informed  
that at no time during sewer construction was there a guarantee that all  
basements would drain to the sewer.

Following the second reading of Ordinance #36, Werley moved, seconded  
by Raines, that Ordinance #36 be adopted. Three votes yes; no votes opposed.  
Motion carried.

Following the second reading of Ordinance #37, Roberts moved, seconded  
by Werley, that Ordinance #37 be adopted. Three votes yes; no votes opposed.  
Motion carried.

After discussing the sewer inspections and building inspections, Mayor  
Meyer appointed Connie Crocker as Building Inspector. Raines moved,  
seconded by Roberts, that the appointment of Connie Crocker as Building  
Inspector be confirmed by the Council and that the Building Inspector be  
paid for inspections at the rate of 50% of permit fees. Three votes yes;  
no votes opposed. Motion carried.

Following a discussion of the question of parking house trailers  
temporarily within the city limits, Raines moved, seconded by Werley, that  
temporary permits not to exceed 45 days be issued to Merle Mathia and John  
Lindel to park a house trailer within the city limits. Three votes yes;  
no votes opposed. Motion carried.

City Attorney Murray discussed settlement of the question of the Hedge  
property stating that the original appraisal was for \$737.00--to settle it  
would cost the city an additional \$263.00. Roberts moved, seconded by  
Werley, that settlement not to exceed \$1,000.00 be made on the Hedge  
property. Two votes yes; one vote opposed. Motion carried.

Following a discussion of the damage caused to the Ambrose Jennings  
property, Raines moved, seconded by Werley, that Jennings be paid \$110.00  
damage per easement contract. Three votes yes; no votes opposed. Motion  
carried.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
