

Resolutions for the issuance of temporary notes #1 and #2 in the amount of \$25,000.00 each to defray costs of Sewer District #2. Raines moved, seconded by Van Tuyl, that an emergency be declared and the resolutions be passed. Four yes votes; no opposed votes.

Roberts moved, seconded by Raines, that the city of Basehor purchase a steel file cabinet from John Klinkenberg for \$70.00 Motion carried.

A letter from the City-County Health Department was read which stated that the persons living in the Orma Kemler property in South Basehor were in violation of Ordinance #10 which relates to nuisance and unsanitary conditions. Murray will send a letter ~~to~~ Orma Kemler giving ten days notice to clean up the area and comply with such ordinance.

Roberts stated that the city of Basehor would require two hundred street signs to be placed on the street corners. He noted that this figure should be kept in mind when making out the budget.

In regard to the question of having a petty cash fund, Murray suggested that when individuals pay for city material from their own personal funds, that individual should submit a request for reimbursement through the prescribed ordinance.

There was a discussion of the radar unit, roads, and culverts. However, there was no council action taken.

Roberts reported on the meeting of the Leavenworth County Steering Committee and its plans for forming a Planning Commission *(County wide)*.

Following a discussion and formulation of the budget for 1970, Roberts moved, seconded by Worley, that the tentative budget be published and a public hearing be set for August 12, 1969. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
