Special Council Meeting

July 22, 1969

Present: Mayor Meyer, Councilmen Roberts, Raines, Worley, Van Tuyl, and Eberth.

Others present: C. Newman, City Clerk, John Murray, City Attorney, Bruce Browne, Engineer.

No minutes of previous meetings were read as this was a special meeting.

Browne updated the council on the status of the Bethel Plumbing and Heating Company, contractor on the sewer project. The contracting firm is in the hands of receivership and is in the process of complying with legal commitments. However this will not affect the sewer project except to delay start of construction a short time.

Murray explained that the contractor being in receivership in no way changes the contract. Actually the city of Basehor is in a position to secure an adequate job because the bonding company will be keeping a closer check on the contractor to insure full compliance with the bonding agreement.

Patrons of the sewer district may expect to connect to the sewers in early spring providing there are no more unforeseen complications. The contract for the second phase of the sewer project may be let thirty to forty-five days from this date.

Murray explained the issuance of temporary notes to the council and there followed these new ordinances:

Ordinance #21 regarding the creation of Sewer District #1. Lester Worley moved, seconded by Raines, that an emergency be declared and the ordinance be passed. Four yes votes; no opposed votes. *North Dist.*

Ordinance #22 for the issuance of temporary notes in the amount of \$95,000.00 for Sewer District #1. Raines moved, seconded by Roberts, that an emergency be declared and the ordinance be passed. Four yes votes; no opposed votes.

Resolutions for issuance of temporary notes #1 and #2 in the amount of \$25,000.00 each to defray costs of the Sewer District #1. Roberts moved, seconded by Worley, that an emergency be declared and the resolutions be passed. Four yes votes; no opposed votes. *South Dist.*

Ordinance #23 regarding the creation of Sewer District #2. Van Tuyl moved, seconded by Worley, that an emergency be declared and the ordinance be passed. Four yes votes; no opposed votes.

Ordinance #24 for the issuance of temporary notes in the amount of \$105,000.00 for Sewer District #2. Roberts moved, seconded by Raines, that an emergency be declared and the ordinance be passed. Four yes votes; no opposed votes.

Following a discussion regarding the rate charged Rural Water District #4 for permits for laying water lines, it was generally agreed by the council members that the charge be discontinued on the basis that such is not required under present ordinances. Permits showing work to be performed and by whom will, however, continue to be a requirement.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
