

City of Basehor, Kansas

Council Meeting

Oct. 7, 1969

Present: Mayor A. Meyer, Councilmen R. Raines, L. Worley, R. Van Tuyl,
and B. Eberth.

Others present: C. Newman, City Clerk, R. Warden, City Treasurer, J. Murray,
City Attorney, Mrs. R. Crocker, and Mrs. M. Bell.

Mayor Meyer called the meeting to order. Minutes of the previous
meetings of Sept. 2, 1969 and Sept. 23, 1969 were read and approved.

The treasurer's report was read by R. Warden. R. Raines moved, seconded
by L. Worley, that the treasurer's report be accepted as read. Three votes
yes; no votes opposed. Motion carried.

The Treasurer and City Clerk up-dated the City Council on the status of
the 1969 budget:

Mrs. R. Crocker and Mrs. M. Bell presented to the City Council the signs
"Wanted Alive - Our Children" and discussed the location. Eight signs will
be installed at locations agreed and stated in the minutes of July 8, 1969
Council meeting. Signs are to be installed by the Boy Scout Troop #169.

Mayor Meyer brought up for discussion the question of individuals
starting construction or remodeling of a building without first having secured
a permit. According to Ordinance #13 an Enforcement Officer is to be
appointed by the Council to enforce the ordinance. In the absence of a
permanent officer Mayor Meyer appointed Lester Worley, on a temporary basis,
to act as Enforcement Officer to fulfill the requirements of Ordinance #13.
R. Raines moved, seconded by R. Van Tuyl, that members of the Council confirm
the appointment. Two votes yes. No votes opposed. Motion carried.

Mayor Meyer then brought up the question of the City accepting new streets.
It was pointed out that when a plat is accepted the streets are removed from
the tax rolls and that when the City accepts a street the City is then
obligated to maintain that street. This posed the question of requirement
standards of new streets before acceptance by the City of Basehor. Following
a general discussion B. Eberth moved, seconded by R. Van Tuyl, that the
following resolution be adopted:

"Requirements For Acceptance of New Streets by the City of Basehor"

1. All future plats shall have a right of way of 60 feet (width).
2. The street shall have been built and rocked for a period of one
year.

3. Grader ditches shall be of sufficient grade to properly drain surface water; rock base shall be 26 feet wide and of sufficient base for oil. Such conditions as stated shall be examined and approved by the County or City Engineer with the final approval vested in the City Council.
4. Streets shall extend to the intersections, turn around circles (cul-de-sac) or to the end of platted property.

The resolution was accepted with four votes yes and no votes opposed.

Following a discussion in regard to the question of traffic fines, traffic court, and the lack of a report on same, it was suggested that the City Clerk write a letter to the Police Judge stating that the City Council is requiring a monthly activity report. Such report should be similar in form to that used by previous office holders showing name of violator, ticket number, amount of bond, amount of fine, court cost, and amount deposited with the City of Basehor.

At the request of the Skyliners 4-H Club the Council granted them permission to paint a crosswalk on the street north of the intersection at the Jr. High School.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
