### Projects on the Horizon: 155th Street Improvements

155th street is currently an intersection with a roundabout. These improvements will add a 10 foot wide multi-use path for pedestrian, bicycle traffic along with a 5 foot wide sidewalk on the opposite side of the roadway. The total estimated cost for the project is \$11,255,200. The City of Basehor received a grant for the project in the amount of \$7,435,056 from the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC). The improvements will start at Wolf Creek Parkway north on 155th Street to just past United States Postal Service. The project is scheduled to begin in 2024. The project will include street trees, native grasses and street trees. The intersection at Parallel Road will be improved with a roundabout. These improvements will add a 10 foot wide multi-use path for pedestrian, bicycle traffic along with a 5 foot wide sidewalk on the opposite side of the roadway. The total estimated cost for the project is \$11,255,200. The City of Basehor received a grant for the project in the amount of \$7,435,056 from the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC). The improvements will start at Wolf Creek Parkway north on 155th Street to just past United States Postal Service. The project is scheduled to begin in 2024. The project will include street trees, native grasses and street trees.

### Projects on the Horizon: Sentinel Park

The 4-acre parcel was donated to the City of Basehor in 2020 and the City has been hard at work alongside an incredible group of students from Basehor-Linwood High School's Innovation Academy Emergent Program to plan a park on the donated land. The students researched and planned the park and put together concept drawings including extensive feedback from the community. The landscape architect for the project, Doug Hubert of Indigo Designs, completed all the student plans into one concept drawing shown below.

### Projects on the Horizon: Parallel Road and 155th Street Bicycle/Pedestrian Improvements (Metrogreen)

The project connects Metrogreen and regional bikeway systems in an area of greatest need and growth in the City of Basehor. Inadequate bicycle/pedestrian infrastructure exist along Parallel Rd and 155th Street leaving little options for safe mobility choices. This project directly connects to programmed improvements on 155th Street. The project will include a multi-use path along Parallel Rd and 155th Street, safe pedestrian crossings, off-road trail along an identified Metrogreen corridor. The project will include street trees, native grasses and stormwater best management practices. The total estimated cost for the project is \$1,818,380. The City of Basehor received a grant for the project in the amount of \$500,000 from the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC). The improvements will start at the Basehor Community Library and continue north on 155th Street to Parallel Road. The improvements will continue east on Parallel Road to connect to the improvements included in the 155th Street Improvements project. Construction is scheduled to begin in late 2023 and complete in 2024. The project will have multiple open house events to receive public input.

### Chief's Corner: Keeping Basehor Safe

The Basehor Police Department is under the command of Chief Kevin L. Salas. The Basehor Police Department consists of 15 sworn officers, including the Chief and Deputy. The department includes a Police Clerk and an Animal Control/Code Enforcement Officer. The department's primary focus is the safety of the citizens of Basehor. Our Police Department is fortunate in keeping our community safe and Basehor is currently safe in Kansas. Here are some crime statistics for 2021 as of the end of November. ### Budget and Taxes

The City of Basehor prepares and presents to City Council an operating budget and capital improvement plan (CIP) for their review and approval annually. The primary purpose of the City's budget and budgeting process is to develop, adopt, and implement a plan for accomplishing goals for the upcoming year within given constraints. The 2022 budget was designed and adopted to be consistent with the long-term vision of the City and the overriding objectives of maintaining a responsive and financially stable position while providing efficient and high-quality services levels.

Some of the highlights of the 2022 budget are:

- No increase to the tax rate
- Fully staffed, equipped, and trained Police Department
- Plans to inventory all street conditions for a long-term plan for road maintenance and improvements
- Enhances investments in communication, such as the *Basehor Quarterly* and improvements to the City's website

Every property in Basehor receives a tax bill from the Leavenworth County Treasurer's Office. That tax bill includes the tax billing for all taxing authorities in Basehor, including the state of Kansas, Leavenworth County, USD 458 School District, Paramount Township Fire District, and the Basehor Community Library. The City of Basehor's portion of your tax bill is 23%. The remaining 77% of the bill goes to those other taxing authorities. Above is an example of where your tax dollar goes. 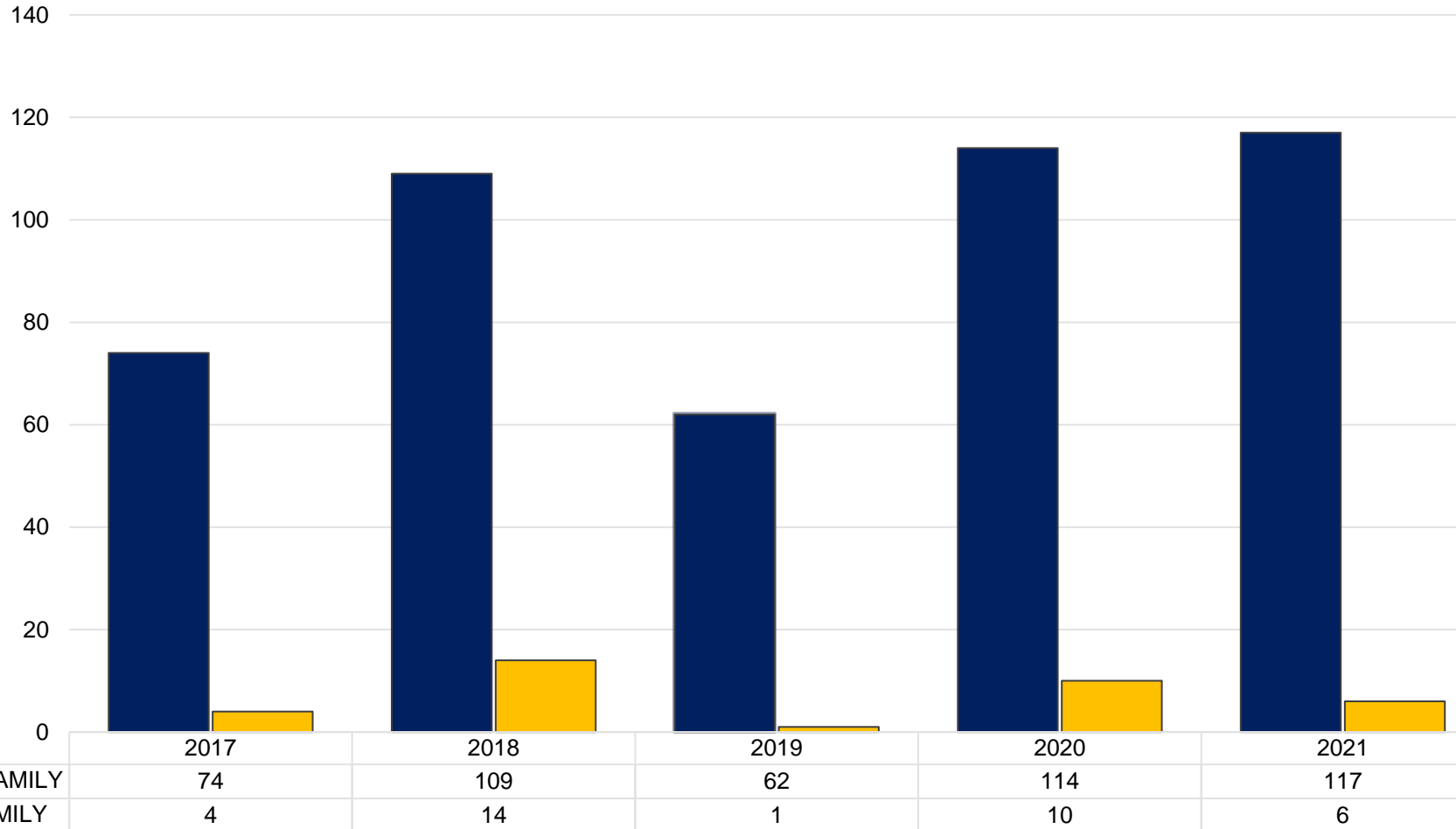

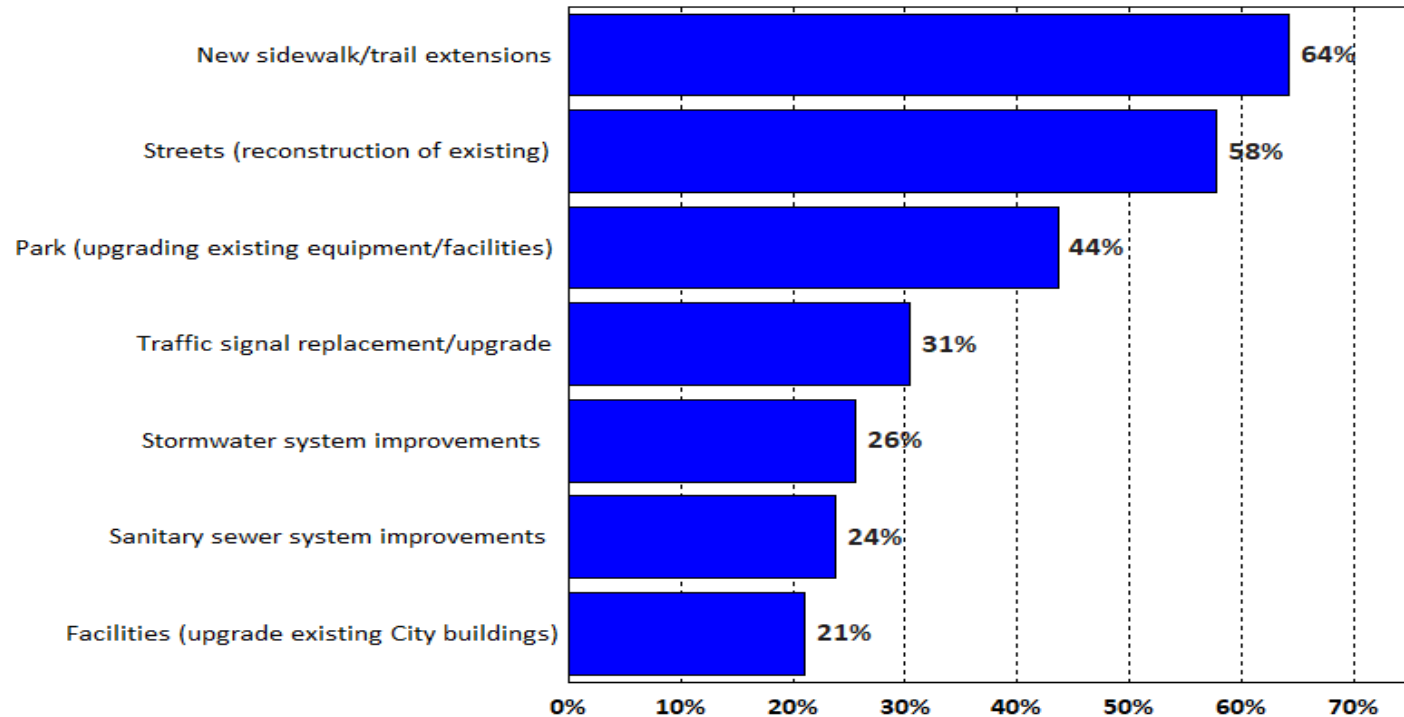

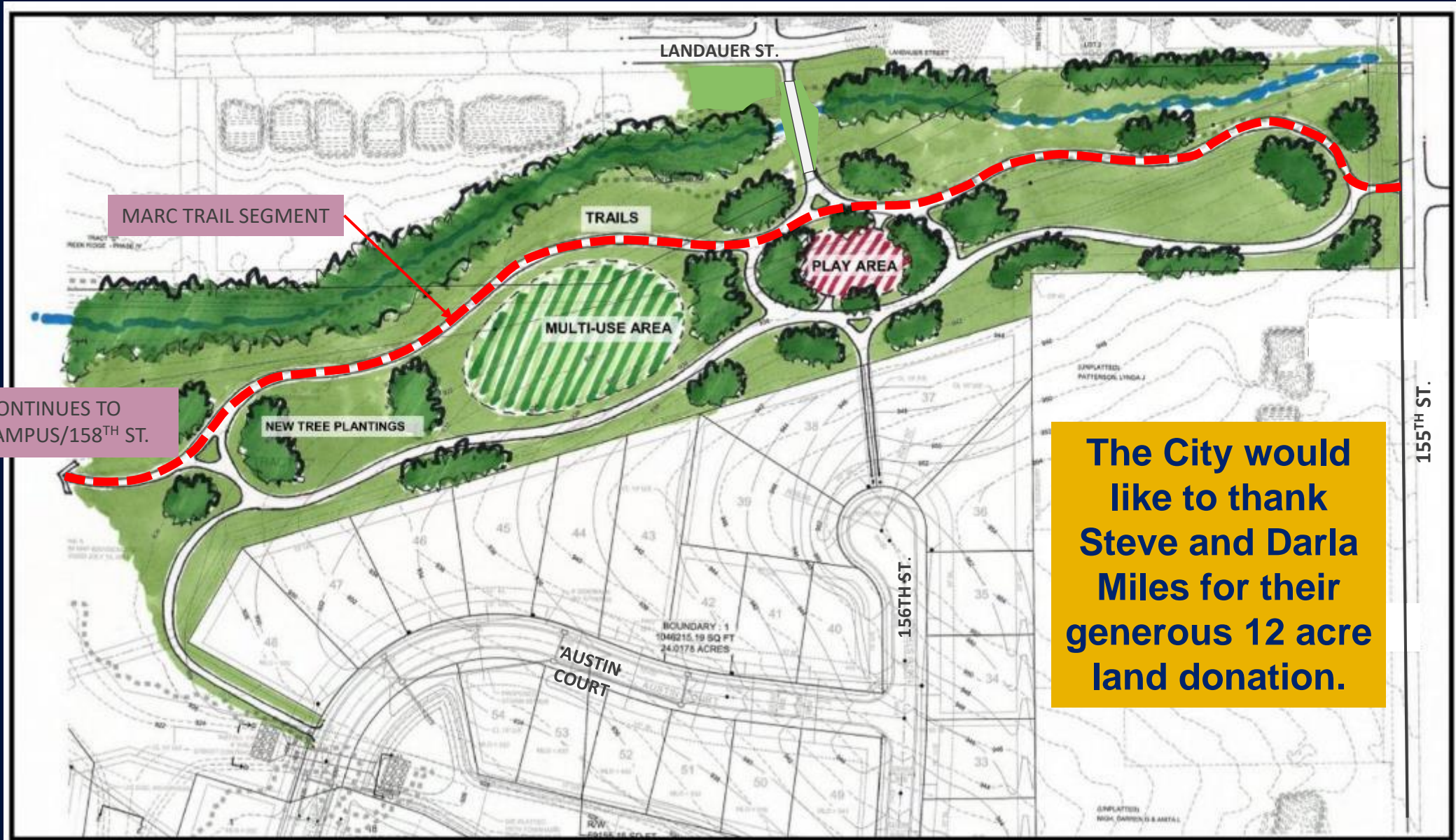

# 158TH ST TRAIL PROJECT

- The City received \$500,000 toward the MetroGreen Trail Project from Mid-America Regional Council
- Trail system will extend from 155<sup>th</sup> Street to 158<sup>th</sup> Street and over to Parallel Road
- The MetroGreen Trail will be a multi-use path that will tie into the 155<sup>th</sup> Street improvements



# 155<sup>th</sup> Street Complete Street Improvements

- Addition of turn lanes as needed
- Stormwater improvements with adequate green infrastructure
- Roundabout at intersection with Parallel Rd
- 10 feet wide Multi-Use Path for pedestrian and bicycle traffic
- 5 feet wide sidewalk on opposite side of roadway
- Allows for curbside drop-off zones (micro-transit and ridesharing services)
- Awarded \$7,435,056 in federal grant money for the project
- Construction to begin end of 2023
