This multiuse campus features various amenities for the community, including a splash pad, playground, event lawn, walking trails, a fishing pond, sledding hill, amphitheater, and other civic facilities. It was so great getting to see the children (and some adults!) splashing around on the night we opened the splash pad.

Additional facilities will continue to open as they are finished. I can't wait to see people enjoy this space for years to come. I frequently get asked if the pond will be stocked with fish. The answer is, "yes!" We will be stocking the pond at a future date for "catch and release" fishing.

I am also excited to share with you that the improvements on 155th Street continue to make progress, and I would like to thank our entire community for their cooperation and patience during this construction. I understand how inconvenient road construction and detours can be, but I am grateful to see this much of the project come to a finish for our community. We'll continue to share the most recent information about closures, detours, and re-openings on the City's website and social media channels.

Lastly, I want to take a moment to thank our community for their support of the upcoming 3rd Annual Mayor's Golf Tournament! We sold out of team spots in a record number of just 12 days! This tournament is the largest fundraising event for the Mayor's Charity Fund and the

We are so excited to share with our community the opening of several park amenities at Basehor Civic Campus! This community-centered facility encompasses 37.6 acres of land and features a splash pad, event lawn, playground, sledding hill, fishing pond, amphitheater, walking trails, and other civic facilities.

On August 8th we cut the ribbon and turned on the sprinklers to the new splash pad and more! The splash pad is now open through Sept. 30 from sunrise to sunset. When visiting it, be sure to push the button to turn on the sprinklers as they are on a timer to conserve water.

The new docks at the fishing pond are now open and fish will be stocked at a future date for "catch and release" fishing.

The playground opened on August 19 is also open from sunrise to sunset.

We are nearing the end of budget season! City staff and elected officials have been working hard to craft the City of Basehor's 2025 budget that delivers quality services without increasing the City's mill rate.

- Proposing no property tax rate increase.
- A desirable place to live, work, and grow a business.
- Continuing to promote fiscal transparency and stewardship.
- Advancing trails and parks projects.
- A place where we take pride in our community and its safety.

The City of Basehor has presented on the City's budget in 7 public meetings over the last several months.

In accordance with applicable state law, the City holds two public hearings on the proposed budget each year. Both hearings were announced in the local newspaper as required, and also on the City's website, social media channels, and eNews.

CODES COMPONENT

With this upcoming election season, we would like to remind our community that Kansas state law permits the placement of temporary political signs within private property and any right-of-way during the 45-day period prior to an election and two days after. These temporary signs are allowed as long as they otherwise meet the City's regulations on temporary signs and do not impose safety concerns.

As a reminder, no other signs are authorized to be placed in the right-of-way and are subject to immediate removal. Thank you all for your assistance with keeping our city clean and safe



CITY OF BASEHOR CODES FOR TEMPORARY SIGNS:

☐ Height Restrictions:

Residential Properties

- Signs cannot exceed 8 square feet
- Maximum height of 4 feet

Commercial & Industrial Properties

- Signs cannot exceed 16 square feet
- Maximum height of 8 feet

☐ Signs cannot have more than 2 sides and cannot be illuminated.

☐ Only 3 signs shall be permitted per property.

☐ Signs may only be displayed for up to 60 days.

All signs placed within the Right-of-Way will be immediately removed

Trash Service Holiday Delays

Trash and recycling services will be delayed on the following holidays:

Labor Day

Christmas Day

Thanksgiving Day

New Year's Day

When a holiday occurs during the week, any service days regularly scheduled on or after the holiday will be delayed by one business day.

City of Basehor Staff Highlight: Lt. Peter Martin

Can you please share with us where you grew up?

I grew up and am originally from Auckland, the biggest city in New Zealand. At 18, I was awarded the opportunity to go to high school in California for a year and play basketball. Then that just sort of led from one thing to another. Even if it had just been for the one year like originally planned, it would've been the greatest experience. Basehor has a lot of exciting projects happening. What is your favorite project and why?

I just love Basehor as a town. It's exciting, the city is growing. Joining this police force is just the best thing that could've happened for me in my profession. I love this place and I love the people that I work for and work with. I love it, I have a massive loyalty to the City of Basehor and I look forward to growing our police department as our city continues to grow.
