Basehor City Park Trail Updates

The City was awarded

\$350,000

from the Kansas Department of Wildlife & Parks for this project!

We are excited to share that improvements to the trails at Basehor City Park will begin in June!

The park will remain open while intermittent sections will be closed during the improvements.

Please note that all the park shelters will be closed and no reservations will be accepted while the trail improvements are completed.

The trail improvements will include replacing the current 6-foot-wide asphalt trail with a new 10-foot-wide concrete trail. Construction is estimated to be completed by the end of August.

We thank our community for their understanding and cooperation as we complete these improvements.

City of Basehor Staff Highlight: Officer Christopher Williams

How long have you been a police officer?

I knew from a young age that I wanted to be a police officer, since watching the historic movies about Wyatt Earp and Dodge City. I have been a police officer for 17 years. Before becoming a patrol officer, I served for 10 years in the Army as a military police officer.

How long have you worked for the City of Basehor and what made you select Basehor?

I have been with the Basehor Police Department for almost two years now. My family was looking to relocate to the Kansas City area and when I met Basehor's chief of police and the other officers – it felt right and like joining a family. I love working with our guys and gals and just the teamwork that everybody shows.

What is your favorite part about your job?

My favorite part of working for the Basehor police department is getting to serve, meet, and interact with the community that my family calls home. My motto that I tell everyone is: "Buckle up, drive safe, and slow down." I have become known as the "traffic cop" as I have completed 263 traffic stops. However, I have only issued 40 tickets. When I pull someone over for going above the speed limit, I prefer to use the opportunity to interact and educate them on the importance of driving safely versus just handing out tickets. I hope it helps to let our community know that I care about them and their safety.

We have had a lot of new projects completed or currently in the works for Basehor. What has been one of your favorite projects?

I especially like the trails. As a patrol officer, I get to see everybody out and enjoying the trails and parks, walking their dogs, and getting exercise. It has been great to see the trails getting everyone together and enjoying the outdoors.

CODES COMPONENT


It's Springtime! Grass and weeds are growing strongly, trees are bearing leaves, and the birds are singing away. We would like to give a kind reminder that property owners are responsible for ensuring lawns/yards/lots are maintained and do not exceed a height of 12 inches, including vacant lots. This extends to the street in most cases.
