158th St. and Parallel Road Project Update

On. Dec. 23, 2025 158th Street and Parallel Road officially opened to thru traffic.

The Kansas Department of Transportation has approved the general contractor to institute a winter shutdown. The contractor will continue to work in the area over the winter month – however, no roadway work will be completed during this time.

To promote continued safety, the sidewalks and trails in the project

area will remain closed. Please observe all safety signs and do not proceed on a sidewalk or trail beyond any signage indicating closures.

In early Spring, road construction will resume. Small segments will be subject to full closures, and the City will release the new phasing plan/schedule for those closures once they are determined.

The extended completion day for the project will not increase the project cost. As a reminder, the City received \$5.1 million in grant funding from the Mid America Regional Council (MARC) for these improvements. These grant



dollars were awarded through a competitive process.

We would like to thank the community for their patience during this time, as we work to bring these roadway improvements to Basehor.

CODES COMPONENT

Property maintenance plays a vital role in keeping our neighborhoods safe, healthy, and welcoming. Well-maintained homes and businesses help prevent hazards such as pest infestations, fire risks, and structural deterioration, while also preserving property values for everyone in the area. Simple actions—like keeping

grass trimmed, repairing broken fences, and removing debris—can make a noticeable difference.

As your code enforcement officer, I focus on addressing conditions that may impact public safety or quality of life. Common issues include overgrown vegetation, accumulation of junk or abandoned vehicles, peeling paint, unsafe structures, and improper storage of materials. These standards are not meant to be punitive, but preventive—helping property owners identify and correct problems before they become costly or dangerous.

By taking pride in property maintenance and responding promptly to code concerns, residents and property owners contribute to a cleaner, safer, and more attractive community. When we all do our part, we create neighborhoods that are not only compliant with local codes, but places we are proud to call home.

Paving for Progress & Streets Improvement Schedule:

Following the election on Nov. 4, 2025 the citizens of Basehor voted to approve a .5% special citywide sales tax for roads. Collection of the sales tax will begin on April 1, 2026 and includes a 10-year sunset.

Proceeds from the .5% special sales tax are estimated to generate \$7.1 million to fund the Paving the Progress roadway plan. that will provide maintenance to all City streets within 8 years.

In January 2022, the City's Governing Body authorized the

inventory and assessment of all Basehor streets to create a long-term maintenance and improvement plan to support current infrastructure as well as accommodate future growth.
